The two regular bail petitions of the above named petitioners have been filed separately. The petitioners are in judicial custody since 27.01.2026 in connection with the same case i.e. Hajipur Sadar P.S. Case No. 59/2026 registered u/s 304(2) & 317(2) of B.N.S., therefore, the above two regular bail petitions have been taken up together for hearing and are being disposed of through this common order

Heard learned counsels for the accused petitioners as well as learned Public Prosecutor for the State and also perused the record.

It is stated in Para 2 of both bail petition that no bail

application either regular or anticipatory has been filed on behalf of the petitioners before this court of Sessions or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna.

The prosecution case in brief, as per written report of the informant Chandni Devi is that on 25.01.2026 at about 7 P.M. in the evening she was going to home riding on a Toto (E-ickshaw) with her belongings. When she reached at railway overbridge near Ramashish Chowk, two miscreants riding on a motorcycle came very fast near the Toto vehicle and snatched the Purse from her hand. The Purse contained two pairs Payal of silver, Pan Card and about 300-400 cash. After snatching the Purse, both the miscreants tried to flee but on her alarm, they were apprehended by the nearby people. In the mean time police reached there and on interrogation, both miscreants disclosed their name as Abhishek Kumar and Sudhir Kumar. The Purse containing two silver payal, Aadhar Card and Rs.3500/- snatched from the informant was recovered from the possession of Abhishek Anand and from the possession of Sudhir Kumar, a motorcycle bearing registration no. BR31BD 6821 was recovered.

Learned advocates for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent and have committed no offence. They have been falsely implicated in this case. The entire prosecution case is false and concocted. Nothing incriminating articles has been recovered from their possession. Petitioners have no concern with the seized articles. Petitioner Abhishek Anand has criminal antecedent of one other criminal case as mentioned in para 3 of his bail petition. The petitioner Sudhir Kumar has no criminal antecedent. The petitioners are in judicial custody since 27.01.2026. Hence, petitioners may be enlarged on bail.

Learned Public Prosecutor opposed the prayer for bail.

Heard the parties and also perused the record. From perusal of the record, it appears that there is allegation against the petitioners of snatching the Purse, containing Silver Payal, Aadhar Card and Rs.3500/-. The petitioners were arrested by the police on the spot and the articles snatched by them have already been recovered. Petitioners are in judicial custody since 27.01.2026. Petitioner Abhishek Anand has criminal antecedent of one case and petitioner Sudhir Kumar has no criminal antecedent.

Therefore, considering the aforesaid facts, circumstances of the case and nature of the allegations as well as detention period of the petitioners, their prayer for regular bail is allowed and accordingly, the above named accused petitioners of both bail petitions are directed to be released on bail, on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned court below, subject to the further **conditions that**

- (i) The petitioners will not indulge in any kind of such offence and shall appear and report to S.H.O. of concern police station on first week of the every month for a period of one year regarding his activity after being released from custody.
- (ii) The petitioners will not delay the disposal of trial in any manner what so ever and will remain physically present for framing of charge and at the stage of recording of statement under section 351 of B.N.S.S.
- (iii) The petitioners would not repeat similar type of offence in future.

In case of breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, learned Court concern will be at liberty to cancel the bail and send the applicant to prison.

Before accepting the bail bonds of the petitioner, the learned Trial Court is requested to ensure that a copy of this order be sent to the S.H.O. of concern P.S. with direction that, the concern S.H.O. will inform the learned Court if the petitioners fail to appear before him in any month as specified in aforesaid condition.
