The two regular bail petitions of the above named petitioners have been filed separately, who are in judicial custody since 18.02.2026 in connection with the same case i.e. Vaishali P.S. Case No. 130/2026 registered u/ss. 121,132, 115(2), 296, 324(3), 109(1), 351, 352 & 3(5) of B.N.S., therefore, the above two regular bail petitions have been taken up together for hearing and are being disposed of through this common order

Heard learned counsels for the accused petitioners as well as learned Public Prosecutor for the State.

It is stated in Para 2 of both bail petition that no bail

application either regular or anticipatory has been filed on behalf of the petitioners before this court of Sessions or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna.

The prosecution case in brief, as per written report of the informant Nitu Kumari, P.S.I. is that on 17.02.2026 at about 11.15 O'clock the recovered victims namely Babita Kumari, Lakshmi Devi, Kinjan Kumari in connection with Vaishali P.S. Case No. 123/2026 dated 16.02.2026 were kept in the police station for safety. At about 11.30 o'clock the elder sister of Babita Kumari namely Sanju Devi came to meet with her sister Babita Devi and she started taking her sister Babita Devi to outside. When the informant and Chowkidar Jaleshwar Ram, Akhilesh Kumar and Umesh Kumar forbade to go outside, then Sanju Devi became aggressive and started misbehaving and abusing with the informant. She also caught hair of informant and tore her uniform and also started throwing the table-bench and other Govt. papers. Babita Kumari with his sister also started abusing and started pulling the wire of C.C.T.N. due to which the official duty of police station was disturbed and also started snatching pistol from Deepak Kumar, P.S.I.. When the visitor Mritunjay Singh @ Munna Singh and other police personnel tried to intervene, then Babita Devi and Sanju Devi also started misbehaving and committing Mar-pit with them. Babita Devi and Sanju Devi also came out side from the police station and broke the cemented GAMLA and started inflicting the broken part of cemented GAMLA upon the informant and Home-guard Amarjeet Kumar and other police personnel, due to which the informant and Homeguard Amarjeet Kumar became injured. Thereafter the other police personnel came and took both ladies in custody and brought the informant and Amarjeet Kumar to P.H.C. Vaishali for treatment.

The learned counsels for the above named accused petitioners submitted that the accused petitioners are innocent and have

committed no offence. They have falsely been implicated in this case. No occurrence as alleged took place. There is no specific allegation against the petitioners. Petitioners are woman. They have no criminal antecedent. Petitioners are in judicial custody in this case since 18.02.2026. Hence, prayer has been made to release the petitioner on bail.

Learned Public Prosecutor opposed the prayer for bail.

Heard the parties and also perused the trial court record. From perusal of the trial court record, it transpires that there is allegation against the petitioners of committing Mar-pit with the informant and other police personnel at the police station and also making obstruction in discharge of the official duty to the informant and other police personnel. Petitioners are women and they are in judicial custody in this case since 18.02.2026. Petitioners have no criminal antecedents as mentioned in Para 3 of their bail petition.

Therefore, considering the aforesaid facts, circumstances of the case and nature of the allegations as well as detention period of the petitioners, their prayer for regular bail is allowed and accordingly, the above named accused petitioners of both bail petitions are directed to be released on bail, on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned court below.
