Present Regular Bail Petitions filed on behalf of petitioners named above, who are in custody since 13.03.2026 in connection with Nagar P.S. Case No. 219 of 2026, registered u/s 310(4), 310(5), 317(4) of the BNS and 25(1-B)a, 26 and 35 of the Arms Act is put up and moved today.

Heard the learned Counsel for the accused/petitioners and learned Public Prosecutor for the State.

It is stated in para 2 of the bail petitions that no petition for bail either regular or anticipatory has been moved on behalf of the petitioner before this court or before the Honorable High Court Patna.

Ld. Counsel for the petitioner accused/applicant has submitted that petitioner is innocent, has committed no offence and they have been falsely implicated in this case whereas no such occurrence did ever taken place as alleged by the prosecution. Applicant has been made accused on mere suspicion; there is no direct evidence. Applicant is the man of means and there is no question of absconding and tampering the witness if he released on bail and he is ready to furnish bail bonds accordingly to the order of this Court and if she will enlarge on bail, he will not misuse the privilege of bail. The allegations are general, vague and omnibus. Thus the Ld. Counsel submitted that considering the fact and circumstances, the prayer for bail of the petitioner be allowed.

Learned Public Prosecutor for the State vehemently opposed the Bail Petition and prayed to reject the bail of the petitioners.

Prosecution case in brief according to written petition of informant Sikandar Kumar is that on 11/3/26, at approximately 2:00 a.m., a confidential tip was received stating that certain individuals, armed with illegal weapons, were plotting to commit robbery and dacoity within a mango orchard situated at Bhutan Das Math. To verify this information and to take necessary action, the informant, along with his team raided at the place of occurrence specified in the tip. On conducting raid and search in the orchard, five persons were found hiding, who were apprehended. They disclosed their names namely Kishan Kumar @ Bedardi, Vishal Kumar, Ravi Kumar, Gopi Kumar and Mohammad Imran.

1. From Ravi Kumar- From the yellow backpack of Ravi Kumar Two large screwdrivers of the Taparia brand, one iron chisel, two iron rod wrenches, and two knives were recovered.
 2. From Vishal Kumar- A country-made pistol—tucked behind Vishal Kumar's waist—with a live cartridge in its barrel, Three SIM cards from the purse and an Android phone belonging to a 'Poha' company were recovered.
 3. From Kishan Kumar alias 'Bedardi'- a country-made pistol—tucked behind his waist with a live cartridge loaded in its barrel—along with two Apple iPhones and an Oppo Android phone was recovered.

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The apprehended accused persons stated that they had gathered here, armed with country-made pistols and tools, with the specific intent of committing theft and were in the process of formulating a plan. They further disclosed that all the five of them had previously collaborated to commit burglaries in various unoccupied houses; some of the stolen property from these incidents is currently concealed in the rented accommodation of one of the accused— Kishan Kumar @ "Bedardi".

Upon searching Kishan Kumar's residence, the following items from a trolley bag were recovered: a Nikon Coolpix L830 digital camera, a small bag bearing the inscription "Sona Chandi Jewelers, Gujri Road, Hajipur"); inside a bag, two pairs of gold-like bangles and two pairs of silver wristlets for children; a small electronic weighing scale; a Croma brand Bluetooth headphone; inside a small maroon-colored bag (bearing the inscription "Kanakdhara Jewelers, Bekar Ganj, Patna"), a small silver spoon and four small silver wristlets for children; inside a small white-colored bag, two pairs of silver anklets and three pairs of silver toe rings; a black-colored laptop; a Realme tablet; a silver-colored Apple iPad with a charger; inside a small white-colored bag (bearing the inscription "Rajlakshmi Jewelers, Subhash Chowk, Pokhra Mohalla, Hajipur"), four British-era coins and four old coins; a maroon-colored saree; and a laptop charger; cash ₹ 50913; Three switched-off mobile phones were: two Android devices white (Samsung) and one blue (Realme)—and a small keypad phone (Samsung) were recovered.

On the basis of the written report this instant case was registered.

Heard both the parties and perused the case diary and other materials available on record. From perusal of the record, it transpires that the allegation against the petitioners are that they were apprehended along with the other Co accused persons from a mango orchard where they had allegedly assembled for the purpose of making preparation for commit Dacoity. The prosecution case is based on the secret information followed by the raid conducted by the police party. From Perusal of the case diary it transpires that the witnesses in Para 4,5,6,7 namely Rahul Kumar Ranjan, Mohan Kumar, Pradeep Paswan, Ranjit Kewat as well as informant in his re statement has supported the case of the prosecution. It is the specific case of the prosecution that the petitioners were gathered in the mango orchard, in the night at 2:00 am, where on the raid by the police two country made Katta as well as two live cartridges and at the instance of the apprehended persons the stolen articles were also recovered. The petitioners are in custody since 12.03.2026 and the investigation against them is in progress.

Accordingly, the regular bail petitions **B.P. No. 402 of 2026, B.P. No. 446 of 2026, B.P. No. 450 of 2026 and B.P. No. 480 of 2026** is hereby rejected.

If so advised, petitioners may renew their prayer for bail after framing of the charge.
