Heard the learned defence counsel as well as learned Public Prosecutor on the anticipatory bail application filed on behalf of the above named accused petitioners under section 482 of B.N.S.S. who are apprehending their arrest in connection with in connection with Mahua P.S. Case No. 263/2026 for the offences u/ss.126(2), 115(2), 117(1), 118, 109(1), 303(2) & 3(5) of B.N.S.

It is stated in Para 2 of the anticipatory bail petition that no bail application either anticipatory or regular has been filed in the present case either before this court of Sessions or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna.

The case of the prosecution in brief, as per written report of the informant Punam Devi is that on 13.04.2026 at about 5.30 P.M. due to earlier land dispute, all the accused persons as named in the F.I.R. including the petitioners armed with lathi, danda, iron rod came at her door and started abusing. When she protested, accused Pintu Paswan assaulted with iron rod on her head causing head

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injury and blood started oozing out. Accused Amod Paswan and Pramod Paswan caught her and assaulted with lathi and danda. Accused Mahesh Paswan pushed her on the ground and started dragging her, due to which she became semi-naked. Thereafter accused Kabutari Devi and Ratan Devi pulled her hair, due to which she fell down. It is further alleged that accused Sudha Devi snatched gold locket from her neck. On hearing hulla, when her mother-in-law Chhathiya Devi came, they also caused injury to her. They also damaged her house hold articles after entering in to her house.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioners are innocent and have not committed any offence. They have falsely been implicated in this case. The entire allegation is false and concocted. No occurrence as alleged took place. This case is counter blast of complaint case no. 971/2026 filed by co-accused Kabutari Devi against the informant and others. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent. Hence, prayer has been made for anticipatory bail.

Learned Public prosecutor opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Heard the parties. Perused the record and the case diary. From perusal of the record and the case diary as well as materials available on record, it transpires that transpires that the allegation against the petitioners is that due to land dispute they alongwith other accused persons assaulted the informant and her mother-in-law and caused injuries to them. The supplementary injury report of injured/informant Poonam Devi shows that she has **sustained** :-

1. Tenderness over head, Rt. Shoulder, Abdomen & Lower Lip & jaw.

Investigation – NCCT Brain – NAD.

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X-ray right shoulder – NAD. USG – Not done till date.

The nature of injury is simple in nature caused by hard & blunt object.

The supplementary injury report of injured Chhathiya Devi shows that she has **sustained** :-

1. Tenderness over head region & lower jaw.

Investigation – NCCT Brain – No Trauma related injury seen.

X-ray PNS – Normal.

The nature of injury is simple in nature caused by hard & blunt object.

Therefore, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case as well as nature of the allegations, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the above named accused petitioners is hereby allowed and it is ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender, they will be enlarged on anticipatory bail, on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below within four weeks of this order, subject to the conditions as laid down under section 482(2) of the Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita 2023.
