1. This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of above named petitioner, apprehending arrest in connection with **Laukariya P.S. Case No.- 154/2025**, for the offences punishable under section- 126(2), 115(2), 121(1), 132, 221, 224, 351(2), 352 of BNS.

Prosecution case

2. The prosecution story in brief is that on 20.11.2025 at around 3:30 P.M. as per order of the S.H.O. informant went to the disputed land village- Mahadeva, Motraji of law and order. Mukesh Yadav behaved rudely with him and started abusing him. When he tried to explain, he ran towards him grabbed his uniform started pushing him and slapped him.

Submissions of petitioner

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that this is first bail petition and no other bail petition has ever been filed earlier than this on behalf of this petitioner either before this court or any other superior court. The petitioner has no criminal antecedent except Pathkauli P.S. Case no. 161/2024 under section 126(3), 115(2), 117(2), 109(1), 303(2), 3(5) of B.N.S. The petitioner accused has not committed any act of abuse, indecent behavior, assault or threat towards the informant of the aforesaid case, grabbed his uniform and obstructed the official work. The sections alleged in the FIR are not attracted against the petitioner. On these grounds prayed for privilege of anticipatory bail.

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Submission of State

4. Learned P.P. has vehemently opposed the prayer of anticipatory bail.

Discussion

5. Heard and perused the case diary. As per para no. 22 of the case diary no criminal antecedents have been reported against the present petitioner. Witnesses at para no. 6,7 and 8 have supported the prosecution case and specific role has been ascribed to the petitioner, investigation is still going on. The petitioner is alleged to have obstructed officials performing their duties which is very grave charge. At this stage it cannot be ascertained as to the genuineness of the allegation.

6. Having regard to the nature charge, the statements of the witnesses and stage of investigation, a case for grant of anticipatory bail is not made out.

Result

7. Accordingly this anticipatory bail petition filed by above named petitioner is hereby **Rejected**.
