1. This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of above named petitioners, apprehending arrest in connection with **Bagaha P.S Case No.- 29/2026**, for the offences punishable under section- 126(2), 115(2), 109(1), 303(2), 352, 3(5) of BNS.

Prosecution case

2. The prosecution story in brief is that on 22.01.2026 at around 5:00 P.M. informant Rima Devi was returning home from her *Ghota* when on the way, due to previous dispute petitioners started abusing. When the informant objected then Indu Devi assaulted her. At the same time Ayodhya Ram said *Sali* and took her inside the house and started hitting her with an iron rod. Ayodhya Ram hit her with intention to kill her due to which blood started flowing from her neck and she fell unconscious. When Jitu Kumar and Anu Kumari came to rescue, Indu devi hit them with stick and made them fall down. In the state of unconscious, Indu Devi snatched the gold mangalsutra from her neck.

Submissions of petitioners

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that earlier no anticipatory bail petition on behalf of the petitioners have been filed before this court or any higher court. The petitioners are innocent and falsely implicated in this case due to village dirty politics. All sections are bailable except 109(1) and 303(2) which are not

18-03-2026 applicable against the petitioners. No Criminal antecedent are recorded against these petitioners. Both the parties are pattidar and land dispute are pending between them. On these grounds prayed for privilege of anticipatory bail.

Submission of State

4. Learned P.P. has vehemently opposed the prayer of anticipatory bail.

Discussion

5. Heard and perused the case diary. Injury report of Rima Devi, Jitu Kumar and Anu Kumari are extracted at para no. 26 of the case diary. The doctor at S.D.H. Bagaha has opined the injuries to be simple in nature caused by hard and blunt substance. Further there is no corresponding injury found on the neck, as alleged in the FIR. There is no recovery of stolen articles from accused. As per para no. 30 of the case diary there are no criminal antecedents reported against the petitioners. Further the informant Rima Devi w/o Amarjeet Ram appeared before the court and stated that due to intervention of the elders the matter has been resolved and she does not wish to pursue the case any further.

6. Having regard to the nature of injuries caused, clean antecedent and the statement of the victim/informant, a case for grant of anticipatory bail is made out.

Result

7. Accordingly this anticipatory bail petition filed by above named petitioners is hereby **Allowed**. In the event of arrest or surrender of the petitioners within **30 days** from the date of communication of this order, the petitioners are directed to be enlarged on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Court in seisin with **following condition:**

- (i) One of the bailors shall be relative of the petitioners.
- (ii) Both the bailors shall provide their contact details- Mobile number, Whatsapp number, e-mail id (if available) **with an undertaking on affidavit** that these contact details shall not be changed till disposal of
