12.05.2026 A bail application earlier filed on behalf of accused petitioner 1. Vishal Ram under judicial custody since 18.12.2025 in connection with Ramnagar P.S. Case No. 380/2025, u/s-309(6) BNS pending in the learned Court of the SDJM Bagaha has been pressed today. Copy of the same has been served to the learned P.P In-charge for state.

Sri Pushpak Kumar Singhania, learned counsel on behalf of the petitioner and Sri Prabhu Prasad, learned P.P In-charge for state assisted by Sri Brajeshwar Bharti, learned counsel on behalf of the informant are present before the Court.

The prosecution case in brief as narrated in the written application of the informant Ayush Kumar is that on 18.06.2025 at about 03:00 a.m, he was sleeping with his family members such as his wife and daughter at his house in the meantime two persons came to his bed room and abused and also threatened to kill them if they do not handover cash and ornaments. When informant stated that he had no money, one of the criminals caught informant's daughter. When informant and his wife tried to take their daughter back in that course they were assaulted by knife. The informant and his wife sustained injuries on their body. It has been stated that one of the accused persons was identified as Vishal Ram by the informant. Accused persons were having Knife and Katta(country made pistol). Alleged incident was recorded in CCTV. When informant came out of his house, he saw two other accused persons standing in the garden near the informant's house. On the basis of application of the informant, present case was registered.

It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioner that he is quite innocent and has committed no offence as alleged against him and has been falsely implicated in this case. Earlier anticipatory bail of the petitioner was rejected by the Hon'ble High Court Patna vide order dated 10.09.2025 passed in Criminal Miscellaneous No.62971 of 2025. No other regular bail application on behalf of the petitioner has been filed either before this court or any superior court. Petitioner is also named in 1.Ramnagar P.S. Case No.130/2021, u/s-363,366(A)/34 IPC and 2.Ramnagar P.S. Case No.381/2025, u/s-262 BNS. It has been submitted that petitioner was not identified at the place of occurrence by any dweller nearby the informant's house. Nothing has been recovered from the possession of the petitioner. Referring injury report, it has been further submitted that allegedly informant and his wife were assaulted by knife(a sharp weapon) but their injuries

are opined to be caused by hard and blunt object and also all the injuries are simple which falsifies the entire version of the prosecution case. Petitioner voluntarily surrendered before the Court on 18.12.2025 and since then he is under jail custody. Charge against the petitioner has already been framed on 09.04.2026. Hence, he may kindly be allowed bail.

On the other hand learned P.P In-charge for state assisted by learned counsel on behalf of the informant vehemently opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioner and submitted that there is direct allegation against the petitioner to enter the informant's house with another co-accused having knife and Katta and to cause injuries to the informant and his wife when they refused to handover cash and ornaments to the accused persons. Petitioner accused was also identified at the place of occurrence by the informant. Informant and his wife have sustained injuries as explicit from their injury report. Petitioner is also named in two other criminal cases as per paragraph no.57 of case diary. Referring CCTV footage filed in pendrive, it has been further submitted that footage clearly shows how petitioner with his associate broke the door of the informant's house and entered his bedroom in the night having knife and Katta. In view of nature and gravity of offence, petitioner does not deserve bail.

Heard the parties and perused the trial Court record and also went through CCTV footage filed on behalf of the informant in pendrive. Petitioner is named in FIR. There is direct allegation against the petitioner to enter informant's dwelling house in the night with another co-accused by breaking door having knife and Katta(country made pistol) and also to cause injury to the informant and his wife by means of knife when they refused to handover cash and ornaments to the accused persons. Injury report of the informant shows multiple injuries on his body. Informant's wife has also sustained injury on her left arm as explicit from her injury report. Witnesses in their statements recorded in paragraph no. 07,09,24,213,214,215, 216,217 of case diary have stated about the involvement of petitioner accused in commission of the alleged offence and petitioner was also identified by them in CCTV footage. As per paragraph no.57 of case diary, petitioner is also named in two other criminal cases.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case and material available on record as discussed above coupled with nature and gravity of offence, this Court is not inclined to enlarge petitioner accused on bail. Accordingly prayer for bail of the petitioner is hereby **rejected**.
