23.04.2026 A petition has been filed on behalf of petitioner No.1 namely Shailesh Paswan @ Sandesh Paswan. Ld. Advocate for the petitioner pressing the same submitted that due to the arrest of the petitioner, he wants to withdraw anticipatory bail petition on behalf of petitioner No.1. It has been prayed on behalf of the petitioner to permit him for withdrawal of his anticipatory bail petition.

Copy of the petition is served to the learned P.P. In-charge who expressed no objection.

Heard and perused the petition filed on behalf of the petitioner. In view of the prayer made on behalf of petitioner, he is permitted to withdraw his anticipatory bail petition and accordingly, his anticipatory bail petition is hereby **dismissed as withdrawn.**

23.04.2026 Petitioners 2.Usha Devi, 3.Bunni Majhi, 4.Ramavati Devi and 5.Antima Devi apprehend their arrest in connection with Ramnagar P.S. Case No.64/2026, u/s-126(2),115(2),118(1),109(1),303(2),74,352,117(2),351(2),3(5) BNS pending in the learned Court of the S.D.J.M., Bagaha and have filed the present anticipatory bail petition which has been pressed today. Copy of the same has been served to the learned P.P. In-charge for the State. Case diary is available on record.

Sri Ajeet Prasad, learned counsel on behalf of the petitioners and Sri Prabhu Prasad, learned P.P. In-charge for State are present before the Court.

The prosecution case in brief as narrated in the application of the informant namely Indra Majhi is that on 27.01.26 at about 01:00 PM, a Panchayati was arranged to settle the land dispute between the informant and accused persons. In that course, Shailesh Paswan and Usha Devi having sword assaulted informant's son namely Sudama Paswan on his head with the intention of killing due to which he sustained head injury. It has been further stated that Krishna Paswan and Kanhaiya Paswan assaulted informant's elder son Vishwaranjan Paswan causing fracture of his hand. Further they also assaulted Mahesh Paswan and Bhabhichhan Paswan by means of lathi-danda and abused them. When informant's wife Prabhavati Devi came to rescue injured persons, Bunni Manjhi caught hold her and pushed her on the ground and started assaulting her by means of kicks due to which her modesty was outraged. Thereafter Ramawati Devi and Antima Devi pulled informant's wife on the ground by holding her hair and also abused her as well as the informant. Informant and other injured persons were rescued by the Police and thereafter they were sent to the Government Hospital Ramnagar for treatment. On the basis of application of the informant, present case was registered.

It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioners that they are quite innocent and have committed no offence as alleged against them. Earlier no other bail application has been filed on behalf of the petitioners either before this Court or any superior Court. Petitioners have got no criminal antecedent. It has been submitted that informant and petitioners are agnates and there is land dispute between them. There is case and counter case between the parties. It has been further submitted that so far as section 109(1) BNS is concerned, from perusal of F.I.R. it reveals that there is no intention or knowledge to kill the informant and another rather due to the land dispute sudden altercation took place between the parties. Petitioner Nos.2,4 and 5 are lady. As per injury report of all the injured, nature of injury is opined as simple except injury of Vishwaranjan Paswan which is not on a vital part of the body. Hence, they may kindly be granted privilege of anticipatory bail.

On the other hand learned P.P. In-charge vehemently opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioners and submitted that petitioner Usha Devi alongwith co-accused Shailesh Paswan assaulted Sudama Paswan by means of sword causing head injury. Further Bunni Majhi assaulted informant's wife by means of kicks. Petitioners Ramawati Devi and Antima Devi

23.04.2026 also assaulted Prabhawati Devi thrashed her on the ground. Injury report of Sudama Paswan shows lacerated wound on left parietal region opined to be simple caused by hard and blunt object. In view of above, petitioners do not deserve anticipatory bail.

Heard the parties and perused the F.I.R and case diary alongwith injury report. Allegedly petitioner Usha Devi alongwith co-accused Shailesh Paswan assaulted Sudama Paswan by means of sword. Injury report of Sudama Paswan shows a lacerated wound over left parietal region which has been opined as simple caused by hard and blunt object. Anticipatory bail application of co-accused Shailesh Paswan has already been withdrawn. Petitioner Nos.2,4 and 5 are lady. As per FIR, petitioner No.3 Bunni Majhi assaulted Prabhawati Devi by means of kicks, but there is no injury report in case diary in corroboration of the allegation. There is also case and counter case between the parties. Petitioners and informant are agnates and there is land dispute between them.

Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and material available on record as discussed above, petitioners in event of their arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of one month from the date of receipt/production of a copy of this order, are directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/-(ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Court below subject to the conditions as laid down u/s 438(2) Cr.P.C.
