**25.03.2026** Petitioners 1.Sanjay Yadav, 2.Kishor Yadav and 3.Dinesh Yadav apprehends their arrest in connection with Bagaha P.S. Case No.53/2026, u/s-126(2),115(2),109(1),303(2),351(2),3(5) BNS pending in the learned Court of A.C.J.M.-I, Bagaha and has filed the present anticipatory bail petition which has been pressed today. Copy of the same has been served to the learned P.P. In-charge for State. Case diary is available on record.

Sri Mrityunjay Kumar Singh, learned counsel on behalf of the petitioners and Sri Prabhu Prasad, learned P.P. In-charge for State are present before the Court.

The prosecution case in brief as narrated in the written application of informant namely Kailashi Devi is that on 18.02.2026 at about 09:00 am, named accused persons in F.I.R. armed with lathi danda arrived at informant's house in the absence of her family members and started abusing her and their family members and with the intention of forcibly grab disputed land on which Complaint Case No.22/2023 is going on in Civil Court, Bagaha and Sections 107 and 144 have also been imposed. On objection raised by informant, Dinesh Yadav caught hold her hair and thrashed her to the ground, and all the named accused persons in F.I.R. started assaulting her by means of kicks and punches. It has been further alleged that when informant's daughter namely Lakshmi Kumari came to her rescue, Sanjay Yadav thrashed her to the ground and on instigation by Dinesh Yadav, Sadhu Yadav with the intention of killing informant's daughter, assaulted on the head by means of lathi, causing head injury to her and she fell to the ground due to the injury. It has been further alleged that Kishor Yadav snatched a gold chain worth Rs.10,000/- from informant's neck and further all the named accused persons threatened to kill informant. When locals began gathering at the place of occurrence, all the accused persons fled away. After that informant and other injured were treated at the Bagaha Sub-Divisional Hospital. On the basis of written statement of informant, the instant case has been registered.

It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioners that they are quite innocent and has committed no offence as alleged against them and have been falsely implicated in this case. Earlier no other bail application on behalf of the petitioner has been filed either before this court or any superior court. Petitioner No.3 has got no criminal antecedent while petitioner Nos.1 and 2 have got one criminal antecedent as Bagaha P.S. Case No.300/25. It has been further submitted that there is case and counter case between the parties. It has been further

**25.03.2026** submitted that there is no specific allegation of assault against these petitioners rather allegation of assault against Sadhu Yadav. As per injury report of informant's daughter, nature of injury is simple. Hence, petitioners may kindly be enlarged on bail.

On the other hand learned P.P. In-charge for State opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioners and submitted that there is allegation against these petitioners to cause injury to informant and her daughter and further there is specific allegation of chain snatching against petitioner Kishor Yadav.

Heard both sides and perused the F.I.R and case diary. There is specific allegation of assault against Sadhu Yadav and not against these petitioners. As per injury report of informant's daughter namely Lakshmi Kumari, nature of injury has been opined as simple caused by hard and blunt object.

Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and material available on record as discussed above, petitioner in event of his arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of one month from the date of receipt/production of a copy of this order, is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/-(ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down u/s 438(2) Cr.P.C.
