



**Order Below Exh.1 In R.C.S. No.214/2022**  
**[Sachita Ananda Aarekar v. Sujata Rajendra Patil**  
**And Ors.]**

On perusal of record and proceeding it appears that, present suit came to be filed on 11.10.2022. As per order passed below Exh.01, dated 25.09.2024, the suit proceeded ex-parte against defendants.

02. It appears that, the suit is pending for hearing on temporary injunction application (Exh.05) since 06.11.2024. It further appears that, in spite of ample opportunities being given, the plaintiff failed to take proper and effective steps to proceed further. The suit is stale and ineffective since 06.11.2024. Hence, as per order passed below Exh.1, dated 27.11.2025, the suit came to be posted for passing appropriate order. Thereafter also, in spite of ample opportunities being given on 18.12.2025 and 08.01.2026, the plaintiff failed to take proper and effective steps for hearing on temporary injunction application (Exh.05). Hence, as per order dated 08.01.2026, temporary injunction application (Exh.05) came to be filed and the suit was posted for evidence of the plaintiff.

03. It further appears that, the suit is pending for evidence of the plaintiff since 22.01.2026. In spite of ample opportunities being given on 22.01.2026, 05.02.2026 and 18.02.2026, the plaintiff failed to take proper and effective steps to proceed further. The plaintiff and her learned advocate are absent since 09.02.2023. The suit is more than three years old and it is stale and ineffective since 06.11.2024. Hence, it shows that, the plaintiff is not interested to proceed further. In view of above peculiar facts and circumstances, no purpose will be served by keeping pending present stale and ineffective suit. Resultantly, I pass following order :-

**:: ORDER ::**

The suit is dismissed in default of the plaintiff.
