

Interim Bail Application No. 508-2026
STATE Vs. AMBE @ SONIA
FIR NO. 35/2026, PS Gulabi Bagh
U/s 21/29 NDPS Act

This is an application U/s 483 of BNSS, 2023 seeking grant of interim bail to the applicant/ accused Ambe @ Sonia for a period of 20 days.

Reply to the interim bail application is filed. Copy be supplied to the Ld. counsel for the applicant/ accused as and when required.

Arguments heard.

Ld. counsel for the applicant/ accused submits that the applicant/ accused Ambe @ Sonia was admitted to interim bail for a period of two days due to marriage of her younger brother. Now, she has surrendered.

Ld. counsel for the applicant/ accused submits that the son namely Rudra of the applicant/ accused, aged about one and half years, is suffering from fever, loose motion and vomiting and he is hospitalized in Jiwan Cheritable Hospital, Mangolpuri, Delhi. He further submits that there is no one in the family of the applicant/ accused to look after her son as her husband is also in JC in some other case.

In view of abovesaid, he requests that the applicant/ accused may be admitted to interim bail for a period of 20 days.

Per contra, Ld. Addl. PP for the State as well as IO

(by way of reply) have opposed the interim bail application of the applicant/ accused stating that the father-in-law of the applicant/ accused is available with the son of the applicant/ accused. They further submit that the father of the son i.e. the husband of the applicant/ accused Saurav @ Saurabh has also filed an interim bail application in case FIR no. 219/25 of PS Crime Branch. According to them, the present applicant/ accused as well as her husband are involved in NDPS case of commercial quantity. They further submit that as per the reply of IO, the sister of applicant/ accused is available in the hospital to look after the son of the applicant/ accused. They further submit that applicant/ accused may be admitted to interim bail for a period of five days only.

Submissions considered. Record perused.

As per record, the son of the applicant/ accused, who is aged about one and half years old, is undergoing treatment. IO has verified the age of the child and the fact that he is undergoing treatment, therefore, only on humanitarian grounds, the applicant/ accused **Ambe @ Sonia** is hereby granted interim bail for a period of **10 days (Ten Days)** from the date of her release on furnishing personal bond for a sum of Rs. 35,000/- with one surety in the like amount subject to following conditions :-

- (i) The period of 10 days (Ten Days) will be counted from the date of her release;
- (ii) The applicant/ accused will duly surrender in the Jail upon expiry/ completion of said period of **10 days(Ten Days)**;
- (iii) The applicant/ accused shall not indulge in any criminal activity;

Contd/-...

(iv) The applicant/ accused shall furnish her address of her availability during the interim bail period to the IO/ SHO;

(v) That the applicant/ accused shall upon her release give her mobile number to the concerned IO/ SHO and shall keep his mobile phone 'switch on' all times.

(vi) The applicant/ accused will not influence the witnesses nor tamper with any evidence;

(vii) That applicant/ accused shall not leave the country without permission of the Court;

(viii) That applicant/ accused shall appear on each and every date of hearing before the Court.

The present interim bail application is **disposed of** accordingly.

Copy of the order be given *dasti* to the learned counsel for applicant/ accused as well as IO concerned. Another copy be sent to the concerned Jail Superintendent for information. Jail Superintendent concerned is directed to file a report with respect to the date of surrender of the applicant/ accused in the Jail after expiry of her interim bail period.
