ORDER:

Apprehending arrest, the applicants have filed the instant application under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail.

2. Notice of bail application was given to the State, ld. Addl. PP appeared on behalf of the State, IO produced the record.

3. The instant FIR was registered on the statement of Sunita Rani wife of Sohan Singh. According to her, on 10.03.2023 at about 05.00 pm, she was present in her house. Sahibnoor-son of her brother-in-law

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asked her son Amritpal Singh to sit on the motor-cycle. Varinder Singh son of Balbir Singh by calling her son asked as to why he was looking towards him desperately with blemishing eyes. In the meantime, he caught hold of her son. She rescued her son and brought to him inside the house. Thereafter, Narinder Singh son of Inderjit Singh son Balbir Singh and Balbir Singh son of Bhajan Singh entered in the house armed with daat, stick and rod. The inflicted injuries to Amritpal Singh, Kamalpreet Kaur and Manjit Kaur.

4. The learned counsel for the applicants-accused has submitted that the applicants are innocent and have committed no offence. The applicants-accused have been falsely implicated in this case. The applicants are ready to join the investigation. As such, they be entitled to seek pre-arrest bail.

5. Ld. Addl. PP for the State along with Sh. Ramandeep Singh Banwait, counsel for complainant contended that it was a pre-meditated attack caused by the assailants on son Amritpal Singh and daughters Komalpreet Kaur and Manpreet Kaur after entering into the house. The investigation is in process. The offence under Section 326 IPC is to be added. The weapons of offence is yet to be recovered. Learned Addl. PP for the State has clarified that in the police proceedings the name of Inderpal Singh, Narinder Singh and Balbir Singh are mentioned. Ld. counsel for complainant produced on record CT scan of Amritpal Singh, in which doctor mentioned fracture of right nasal bone. As such, the bail

application merited dismissal.

6. I have considered the respective contentions of the Ld. counsel for the parties and have also gone through the record.

7. The accused-applicants along with other co-accused inflicted injuries to Amritpal Singh and Komalpreet Kaur and Manpreet Kaur after entering into the house of complainant. According to prosecution, the applicants used deadly weapons in the commission of the crime which are yet to be recovered. During the incident the nasal bone of Amritpal Singh is stated to have broken. Being so, in the opinion of the Court, no exceptional circumstances are made out in favour of the applicants to release them on bail as custodial interrogation is required to throw light on the real facts. Accordingly, bail application of the applicants/accused is hereby dismissed. Police record be returned and bail papers be consigned to the record room.
