This case came before me on 08.07.2026 for final hearing in the presence of Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor for the State and of Sri R. Krishna and Sri P. Gangappa, Advocates for Accused. Upon perusing the material available on record having stood over for consideration till this day this court delivered the following

: : J U D G M E N T : :

1. The Sub-Inspector of Police, Singanamala Police Station, filed a charge sheet against the accused in Crime No.135 of 2018 against the accused Under Section 324 of Indian Penal Code.

2. The brief facts of the charge sheet are that on 20.12.2018 at about 6.00 PM., Lw1/R. Gagaraju @ Raju was proceeding along with his bulls for tying it in shed, which is located at a little distance to his house and on noticing him, the accused took an altercation by saying that as he is not sending his sheep at him for grazing and not allowing to remove the thorny bushes which are across the ratha



and that accused abused Lw1/ R. Gagaraju @ Raju and went to beat with an axe, but Lw1/ R. Gagaraju @ Raju kept crow bar across it, as a result the axe was hit on his head and that he sustained bleeding injury on his fore-head and on noticing Golla Ganganna, his son Jayakrishna, his younger brother Ganganna, Jangu Gangireddy, Nagendra, Hrijana Narappa, who are the followers of Ravindra, Lw1 presumed that they may attack him and due to fear Lw1 left the place and went at the outskirts of the village and hidden in fields of Golla Nitturu Narayanappa and due to giddiness he was fell in the fields. On coming to know Lw2/R. Vijaya Mohan, Lw3/R. Neelamma, Lw4/R. Ademma, Lw5/R. Lakshmanna, Lw6/G.N.Chithambara Reddy and Lw7/U. Jagathi Nagi Reddy were noticed Lw1/R. Gagaraju @ Raju and that he was shifted to Government General Hospital, Ananthapuramu on 21.12.2018 at 2.50 AM., and admitted him for treatment.

4. The statement of Lw1/R. Gagaraju @ Raju, Lw9/B. Venkateswarlu was registered a case in Cr.No135/2018 for the offence Under Section 324 of Indian Penal Code of Singanamala Police Station. During the course of investigation Lw9/B.Venkateswarlu inspected the scene of offence and examined and recorded U/Sec.161 Cr.P.C statements of Lw1/R. Gagaraju @ Raju, Lw2/R. Vijaya Mohan, Lw3/R. Neelamma, Lw4/R. Ademma and Lw5/R. Lakshmanna. Lw11/J. Prasad Babu took-up investigation and verified the investigation of Lw9/B. Venkateswarlu and Lw7/U. Jagathi Nagireddy Issued wound certificate of Lw1/R. Gagaraju @ Raju and opined that the injury sustained by him is simple in nature and after completion of investigation, LW9/B.Venkateswarlu filed the charge sheet.

5. This Court took cognizance of offence Under Section 324 of Indian Penal Code against Accused. On his appearance, case copies were furnished under Section 207 Cr.P.C. Accused was examined under Section 239 of Cr.P.C and charge was framed under Section 324 of Indian Penal Code. The charge was read over and explained to Accused in Telugu, to which he pleaded not guilty and claimed to be tried.



6. To prove its case, the prosecution examined PW1 and PW2 and marked Exhibits P1 to P3. However, PW1 (Complainant and victim) turned hostile and did not support the prosecution. PW2 is the son of complainant and he also turned hostile and both of them did not know anything about this case. PW1 and PW2 admitted their signatures on Exhibit P1 to Ex.P3 but denied its contents. As the material witnesses, including the victim, turned hostile. Hence, the prosecution failed to prove its case beyond reasonable doubt.

7. In the result, Accused is found not guilty for the offence under Section 324 of Indian Penal Code. The accused is acquitted under Section 248(1) Criminal Procedure Code. The bail bonds of the accused shall be in force for a period of 6 months as per Section 437-A of Criminal Procedure Code. The marked and unmarked property if any shall be destroyed after appeal time.
