**ORDER**

1. This order of mine shall dispose of first application for regular bail under Section 439 Cr.P.C moved by accused/applicant Prabhdeep Singh in case FIR No. 63, dated 03.04.2024, for the offence under Sections 25 of Arms Act, Police Station Sadar, District Jalandhar.

2. Perusal of the record reveals the fact that ASI Mangat Singh alongwith other police officials were present in connection with patrol duty in the area of Bhode Samrawa Chowk to Jandiala, when secret

informer given information that Prabhdeep Singh son of Gurcharan Singh (accused/applicant) is keeping one unlicensed weapon always with him and today he is also coming from Jandiala side on foot. Believing the information reliable, police has got registered the case against accused Prabhdeep Singh and later on apprehended him.

3. Learned counsel for the accused/applicant pressed for bail on the ground that the accused/applicant is in judicial custody and false case has been planted upon him. He further pressed that alleged offence is triable by the court of learned JMIC and prayed for grant of bail on these grounds.

4. Learned Additional Public Prosecutor opposed the bail application and prayed for dismissal of same.

5. I have heard the learned counsel for the accused/applicant, learned Addl.P.P for the State and have gone through the police record.

6. After hearing their respective submissions and perusal of record reveals the fact that FIR was registered on the basis of secret information and accused/applicant was apprehended by the police. The allegations levelled in the FIR have yet to be established during trial, whereas alleged offence is triable by court of learned JMIC. The completion of investigation, presentation of challan and conclusion of trial is likely to take long time. No useful purpose would be served by detaining the accused/applicant for an indefinite period as pretrial detention would never be considered in the interest of justice. Keeping in view these facts and circumstances of the case, the instant bail application

is hereby allowed and accused-applicant Prabhdeep Singh is ordered to be released on bail on furnishing of bail bonds in the sum of Rs.30,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of learned Area Magistrate/ Ld. Duty Magistrate.

7. However, any observation given in this order shall not effect on merits of the main case. Copy of order be sent to the court of learned Area Magistrate for compliance, whereas bail application file be consigned to the Record Room after due compilation.
