It is submitted by the counsels of the parties that the present case has been settled. As per the settlement, Respondent No.2- insurer has agreed to pay total compensation of Rs.30,000/- to the petitioner, within 30 days subject to the award passed by the court. It is further agreed that the delayed payment would entitle the petitioners to receive interest @ 7.5% per annum for the delayed period.

Joint statement of the petitioner and the Ld. Counsel for Respondent No. 2- Insurer has been recorded in this regard.

Petitioner is directed to get open his bank account (no cheque-book, no ATM) near to the place of his residence and produce relevant documents i.e. bank documents and identification documents on the next date alongwith affidavit regarding his financial status.

The present matter is accordingly referred to the Lok Adalat to be held on **09.05.2026** for passing of the award.
