ORDER

1. This order of mine shall dispose of an application having been filed by applicant-accused seeking bail in view of provisions of Section 483 BNSS in above noted FIR.
2. Notice of the application was issued to the State and the police record has been requisitioned.
3. Learned counsel for the applicant has argued that the alleged recovery of 09 grams of Heroin has been effected and no useful purpose will be serving by keeping applicant behind bars. He contended that accused/ applicant is in judicial custody since 04.05.2026 and no recovery is to be effected from the accused/applicant. He contended that the presentation of challan

would take considerable time and no purpose would be served by keeping the accused/applicant behind bars for an indefinite period of time. Accordingly, he has prayed for grant of bail to the applicant.

4. Per contra learned Additional PP for the State opposed the bail application and prayed for its dismissal.

5. Rival contentions of both the sides have been considered and the record has been perused with due care and circumspection.

6. ASI Sukhwinder Singh No.2822/BTL, P.S. Civil Lines Batala appeared and stated that no other bail application of accused-applicant is pending in any other court. He stated that total recovery in the present FIR is 09 gram Heroin from the applicant and offence under section 29 of NDPS Act has been added in this FIR. He stated that accused/applicant is involved in two other cases under NDPS Act and accused-applicant is in custody since 04.05.2026.

7. Perusal of police record produced before the court reveals that the applicant has been apprehended allegedly in possession of 09 grams Heroin which falls in non-commercial quantity. The applicant/accused was arrested by the police on 04.05.2026 and since then he is in custody. Accordingly, the present accused/applicant is hereby admitted to **interim bail** till the receipt of report of Chemical Examiner on furnishing bail bonds in the sum of Rs.25,000/- with one surety of the like amount which may also be in the form of FDR, in the court of **learned Illaqa/Duty Magistrate** to his/her own

satisfaction and subject to the following conditions:-

- i That he shall attend the court regularly;
- ii That he shall not hinder the ongoing investigation/trial;
- iii That he shall not leave the country without prior permission of the Court;
- iv That he shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him/her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer or tamper with the evidence;
- v. That he shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which he is accused or suspected.

On the receipt of Chemical Examiner report, the same be immediately brought to the notice of this court and accused be also intimated about the report through special messenger by the Investigating Officer. If the salt contained in the contraband in question would not fall in the commercial quantity, the interim bail granted to the accused/applicant be deemed to be absolute. However, it is also made clear that in case it is found from the report of the chemical examination that the salt contained in contraband in question falls within the limit of commercial quantity, the present order granting interim bail to the accused will cease to operate and

would stand vacated automatically and accused would have to surrender and to be taken into custody. Application is allowed accordingly in above said terms. The concerned Magistrate would send the requisite bonds after issuing the release warrants to this court immediately. Copy of this order be sent to the Superintendent, Central Jail, Gurdaspur through e-mail for informing accused about his being released on bail. 8. However, observations made hereinabove shall neither have effect on the merits of the case nor on the bail applications, if filed by other co-accused in this FIR at any later stage. Police record be returned. Bail application file be attached with the remand papers.
