This petition coming before me for final hearing in the presence of Sri Javvaji Prasad Goud, Advocate for Petitioners No.1 and 2 and having been heard and stood over for consideration till to-day, this Court delivered the following:-

:: O R D E R ::

1. This petition is filed under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 (in short 'HM Act') for dissolution of the marriage between the Petitioners solemnized on 08.08.2025, at Raja Prapulla Reddy Function Hall, Thangallapalli Mandal, with mutual consent.

2. This petition is filed on 07.07.2026. After registering the case, it was posted on 13.01.2026. Subsequently, the Petitioners moved advancement and relaxation of cooling period petitions vide I.A.No.461 of 2026 and I.A.No. 462 of 2026 respectively and the same were allowed vide docket orders dated: 30.07.2026.

3. The brief facts of the petition are that:

3.1. The Petitioner No.1 is legally wedded wife of the Petitioner No.2, whose marriage was solemnized on 08.08.2025 at Raja Prapulla Reddy Function Hall, Thangallapalli Mandal, as per their 'Reddy' caste customs and Hindu Dharma Shastra. At the time of marriage, the parents of the Petitioner No.1 presented Sridhana to the Petitioner No.1 without any demand of Petitioner No.2. After marriage, Petitioner No.1 joined the society of Petitioner No.2 at Kurthi Village, Pitlam Mandal, Kamareddy District. They lead happy marital life for a period of one week only and their marriage was consummated, out of wedlock, they have no issues.

3.2. Thereafter, disputes arose between them, which resulted in breakdown of their marital life irretrievably, hence Petitioner left the matrimonial house on 25.08.2025 along with her belongings and Sridhana, since then they have been living separately. During this period, Petitioner No.1 lodged a report against Petitioner No.2 and his family members before SHO, PS Thangallapally, and FIR No.20/2026 was registered, which is pending. Further, despite putting efforts by both Petitioners as well as elders of both Petitioners, they could not reconcile. To avoid multiplicity of litigation, they have decided to take divorce through Court with mutual consent.

3.3. Accordingly, on 20.03.2026, the Petitioners have exchanged their respective articles, which were presented at the time of their marriage, the Petitioner No.1 agreed that, she has no claim over the Petitioner No.2 and she would not claim any amount or anything from the Petitioner No.2 in future for her maintenance and they would not file any criminal or civil cases against them in future and they would withdraw the cases pending before any court of law i.e., FIR No.20/2026 or any other case. Hence, the petition.

4. This Court tried to reconcile both parties, but went in vain.

5. To prove their case, Petitioners, they themselves examined as PWs.1 and 2. Through PW1, Ex.P1 and Ex.P2 are marked. Ex.P1 is the Wedding Invitation Card and Ex.P2 is Marriage Photograph (one in number).

6. Heard arguments and perused the record.

7. Now, the point for determination is:

Whether the Petitioners are entitled for grant of decree of divorce on mutual consent by dissolving their marriage solemnized on 08.08.2025, as prayed for?
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8. **POINT :** The Petitioners filed this petition Under Section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 seeking decree of divorce, on mutual consent.

9. Initially, it is essential to see whether the present petition for decree of divorce on mutual consent is filed after more than a year of their marriage as contemplated under Section 14 of the Hindu Marriage Act or not. As per the petition averments, the marriage of the Petitioners was solemnized on 08.08.2025 and the present petition was filed on 07.07.2026. As such, this petition is maintainable.

10. Further, it is the burden of the Petitioners to establish that they are entitled for seeking divorce, as prayed for.

11. In order to prove the same, the Petitioners got examined as PW1 and PW2 and marked documents i.e., Exs.P1 and P2. In view of the affidavits of both parties and on enquiry, this Court is satisfied that the marriage of the Petitioners has been solemnized on 08.08.2025 and that the averments in the petition are true.

12. Further, from the evidence of PWs.1 and 2, it is found that in view of the compromise, on 20.03.2026, the Petitioners have exchanged their respective articles, which were presented at the time of their marriage, the Petitioner No.1 agreed that, she has no claim over the Petitioner No.2 and

she would not claim any amount or anything from the Petitioner No.2 in future for her maintenance and they would not file any criminal or civil cases against each other in future and they would withdraw the cases pending before any court of law i.e., FIR No.20/2026 or any other case.

13. Moreover, both the Petitioners expressed their willingness for dissolving their marriage and they want to lead their lives independently. Further, from the evidence of PWs.1 and 2, it is established that the Petitioners have been living separately since 25.08.2025 and that there is no chance of reconciliation or reunion between them. In view of the above facts and circumstances of the case, the petition is to be allowed. Accordingly, the point is answered.

In the result, the petition is allowed without costs, granting decree of divorce on mutual consent by dissolving the marriage of the Petitioners solemnized on 08.08.2025.
