BSES RAJDHANI POWER LTD Vs. OM PRAKASH S/O SARDAR
SINGH (Nazafgarh)

Present: Mr. Ashutosh Kumar, AR for the complainant.
Mr. P K Tripathi, Ld. counsel for the complainant.
Accused in person.

The AR of the complainant has filed the list of all the pending electricity theft bills qua the premises in question. Copy of the same is supplied to the accused.

The AR of complainant submits that in all, there are 16 pending electricity theft cases qua the premises of the accused and that total average connected load of the premises is less than 5 KW.

Today before the Court, the accused states that he is ready to settle all the aforesaid electricity theft matters with the complainant/BSES. The accused submits that he is a labourer and that he has no stable source of income. The A.R. of the complainant submits that he can, at his end, give some rebate and that the complainant is ready to settle all the aforesaid matters for a total sum of Rs.58,500/- and that the accused has already made a payment of Rs.3,500/-. Since the accused is ready to settle all the matters, with the intervention of the Court, both the sides have arrived at a settlement, which is as follows :

- (1) The accused is ready and willing to pay **Rs.58,500/-** towards full and final settlement of all the pending electricity theft bills, out of which he has already paid Rs.3,500/-.
- (2) The balance amount of Rs.55,000/- shall be paid in 11 equal monthly installments of Rs.5,000/-, each starting from the month of September, 2025 onwards. The installments shall be paid to the

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complainant at BSES Office, Hari Nagar, New Delhi. The BSES is ready to and shall accept payment in cash.

(3) If there is any other unsettled/unpaid theft bill in the premises of the accused and the total average connected load of the premises is less than 5 KW, then the same will also be deemed to be included in this settlement.

(4) It is agreed between the parties that this instant settlement held between the parties and consequential payment by the accused shall settle the civil liability only and that for the settlement of criminal liability, the accused may resort to the compounding of offence u/s 152 of Electricity Act, 2003 by submitting an application to the District Deputy Commissioner, GNCTD along with the compounding fees as detailed in Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for compounding of offences u/s 152 of Electricity Act, 2003.

Let the A.R. of the complainant as well as the accused sign this ordersheet in acknowledgment of the aforesaid settlement/submissions.

Let a copy of this order be given *dasti* to the accused, as prayed.
