This petition is coming before me on this day for hearing in the presence of Thiru. M.Anbalagan Advocate for the petitioners and of Thiru. K.V. Manoharan, Public Prosecutor for the State and after hearing the arguments of either side and on perusal of available records, this court passed the following....

ORDER

Petition filed U/s. 438 Cr.P.C. Petitioners/Accused pray to grant them anticipatory bail for the offences punishable U/s. 294(b),506(i),109, 428 IPC in Cr.No.233/2022 of Peranamallur police station.

The learned Counsel for the petitioners/Accused stated that the petitioners are the adjacent land owners of the defacto complainant, 2nd and 3rd petitioners are living at Chennai, they are innocents of any offences as alleged by the respondent, they have been falsely implicated in this case, the investigation is almost over, they are ready to abide any condition imposed by this court, they are hereby undertakes that they will not abscond and will not tamper any witness and they pray for anticipatory bail.

The Learned Public Prosecutor for the State vehemently objected for granting anticipatory bail to the petitioners/accused by stating that the petitioners/accused abused the defacto complainant in filthy language and threatened with dire consequences and they killed the chickens of the defacto complainant.

Heard Both sides. Records perused. The case was registered against the petitioners/accused for the offences punishable u/s. 294(b),506(i),109, 428 IPC. The case of the prosecution was that petitioners/accused were killed the chickens of the defacto complainant worth about Rs.5000/-. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court inclines to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners/accused with condition. **Anticipatory Bail is granted to the petitioners/accused on strict compliance of the following conditions.**

1. The 1st petitioner/accused is directed to deposit a sum of Rs.5000/-(Rupees Five Thousand only) before the Judicial Magistrate Court , Cheyyar on or before 26.10.2022.

2. The petitioners/ accused shall in the event of arrest by the respondent police or their surrender before the **learned Judicial Magistrate, Cheyyar** within 15 days from the date of this order, be released on bail on their executing a own bond each for a sum of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties each for a like sum of the satisfaction of the **learned Judicial Magistrate, Cheyyar.**

3. The petitioners/Accused are directed to appear and sign before the respondent Police station daily at 10.00 a.m. for a continuous Period of 30 days.

4. The petitioners/Accused shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade them from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer.

5. The Petitioners/Accused shall make themselves available for interrogation by the police officer as and when required.

6. The petitioners/Accused shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

7. The petitioners/Accused shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

8. The petitioners/Accused shall not leave the town without prior permission of the Court.
