This is an application under Section 483 BNSS for extension of interim bail moved on behalf of the applicant/accused Balram @ Ballar.

Present: Ms. Promila Singh, Ld. Additional PP for the State.
Mr. Gaurav Vats, Ld. Counsel for the applicant/accused.

1. The present interim bail application has been moved on behalf of applicant/accused to perform the last rites of his father. It is submitted by Ld. Counsel for applicant/accused that applicant/accused is ready to abide by all the terms and conditions. It is prayed that a lenient view be taken.

2. Ld. Addl. PP for the State has strongly opposed the bail application stating that applicant/accused should not be granted bail owing to the gravity of the offence and the active role played by the applicant in the commission of the crime.

3. I have heard the submissions made by the Ld. Addl. PP for the State and Ld. counsel for the applicant/accused.

4. Taking a lenient view on humanitarian ground, interim bail granted to the applicant/accused Balram @ Ballar vide order dated 25.07.2024 is extended for a period of **15 days** from today, for the specific reason mentioned in the application, on the same terms and conditions.

The accused shall surrender himself before the concerned Jail Authorities after expiry the period of interim bail.

Application is disposed off accordingly.

5. It is clarified that nothing stated herein shall tantamount to an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.

6. Copy of the order be given dasti to the Ld. Counsel for the applicant/accused as well as be sent to concerned IO, concerned Jail Superintendent, Ld. Secretary, DLSA (North), through all possible modes, as per rules, by the court staff.
