This petition is coming on this day for hearing before me in the presence of Thiru. AK. Jayagopi Advocate for the petitioner and of Thiru. K.V. Manoharan, Public Prosecutor for the State and after hearing the arguments of either side and on perusal of available records, this court passed the following....

ORDER

Petition filed U/s. 438 Cr.P.C. Petitioner/Accused pray to grant him anticipatory bail for the offences punishable U/s. 147, 148, 353 IPC and 3 of PPDL Act in Cr. No. 147/2022 of Chetpet Police Station.

The learned Counsel for the petitioner/Accused stated that the petitioner/Accused is an innocent of any offences as alleged by the respondent, that the injured persons discharged from the hospital, that the petitioner/Accused has been falsely implicated in this case, that the petitioners are ready to abide any condition imposed by this court, that the petitioner hereby undertakes that he will not abscond and will not tamper any witness and that the petitioner apprehends for arrest and he pray for anticipatory bail.

The Learned Public Prosecutor for the State vehemently objected for granting anticipatory bail to the petitioner/accused by stating that the petitioner/accused and others unlawfully assembled rioting armed with deadly weapon and damaged the mirror of the Jeep worth about Rs.2,000/-. However, he has conceded that no previous case is pending against the petitioner/accused.

Heard Both sides. Records perused. The case was registered against the petitioner/accused for the offences punishable u/s. 147, 148, 353 IPC and 3 of PPDL Act.

The case of the prosecution was that the defacto complainant is a public servant and the petitioner/accused and others gathered with intent to prevent from discharging his duty and damaged the mirror of the jeep worth about Rs.2,000/-. Considering the facts that no one was injured in this case as stated by the learned Public Prosecutor and upon considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court inclines to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner/accused with condition. **Anticipatory Bail is granted to the petitioner/accused on strict compliance of the following conditions.**

1. The Petitioner/Accused shall deposit a sum of Rs.2000/- (Rupees Two Thousand only) before the learned Judicial Magistrate Polur on or before 26.10.2022.

2. The petitioner/ accused shall in the event of arrest by the respondent police or his surrender before the **learned Judicial Magistrate Polur** within 15 days from the date of this order, be released on bail on his executing a own bond for a sum of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties each for a like sum of the satisfaction of the **learned Judicial Magistrate Polur.**

3. The petitioner/Accused is directed to appear and sign before the respondent Police station daily at 10.00 a.m. for a continuous Period of 30 days.

4. The petitioner/Accused shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade them from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer.

5. The Petitioner/Accused shall make himself available for interrogation by the police officer as and when required.

6. The petitioner/Accused shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

7. The petitioner/Accused shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

8. The petitioner/Accused shall not leave the town without prior permission of the Court.
