ORDER

This application is for seeking regular bail under Section 483 of
The Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 filed by applicant in the
aforesaid case.

2. Upon notice, learned Additional PP for State appeared and contested the bail application. Police record received.
3. Heard learned counsel for applicant, learned Additional PP for the State and perused the record.
4. As per the prosecution version, instant FIR was registered on the basis of statement of Assistant Superintendent Vijay Kumar to the effect that on 15.12.2025, he was posted as Ward No. 1 Incharge on duty. At about 05:30 PM after hearing the news of some prisoners/detainees fighting in Ward No. 1, he was taking Buta Singh Warder with him to manage the situation and was explaining to the people fighting and appealing to them to remain calm and peaceful. In the meantime, Sunil Kumar alias Nata,

Bikramjit Singh (present applicant) came out of their respective cells on the pretext of medical treatment and went to Ward No. 1 and taking other prisoners namely Maninder and Shivkaran along started fighting with Vicky Pandit. They tried to stop them, got the security security alarm of the jail sounded and also informed the control room of Commissionerate Police Ludhiana. Both the parties were separated, Vicky Pandit was separated and sent to Main Barrack and lodged the above four persons back in their cells. They started inciting other detainees/prisoners who started raising slogans and creating a ruckus in the jail. When the jail staff were taking action to lock them in the cells, all of them suddenly attacked the jail staff, forced the cell doors open and came out of the barrack and then went to Ward No.1. The remaining prisoners and detainees started to break the locks of the prison. Complainant informed his senior officers about this in the jail control room. The senior officers including the Superintendent of the jail Mr.Kulwant Singh PPS, Mr. Jagjit Singh PPS, DSP Security Jail also came to the spot, who also tried to pacify them, but they alongwith Manpreet Singh, Charandeep Singh alias Sahil, Ranjodh Singh, Ishar Singh alias Yogi, Baljit Singh, Sunil Kumar, Ubed Masih, Sandeep Singh, Lovepreet Singh, Rajat Kumar, Gurvinder Singh, Rohit, Karan Singh, Sandeep, Jashanpreet Singh, Mandeep Singh Pankaj and Parminder Singh attacked the officials with bricks, wooden sticks, rods and other sharp weapons which were already with them as they had made preparation. They tried to escape from the jail. Kulwant Singh Sidhu PPS, Jagjit Singh PPS, DSP Security, Warder

Parminder Singh, SI. Bhupinder Singh, CRPF Constable B.Venketshwar posted for security in the jail, another CRPF Constable Bhupinder Singh sustained serious injuries. Thereafter, a large force came from Commissionerate Police Ludhiana and controlled them. These prisoners/detainees who had sustained injuries during the fight between them were being treated in the jail hospital. The said prisoners/detainees had interfered with the duty of government employees

5. Applicant is in custody since 17.01.2026. No specific attribution regarding head injury is leveled against applicant. So far no report/opinion regarding nature of injuries of injured has been brought on record. Presentation of challan and conclusion of trial will take considerable time. Nothing is to be recovered from him nor any useful purpose will be served by detaining applicant behind the bars. Rather, it will be burden on State Exchequer as no work can be taken from the under-trials in the jail. It will be an exercise in futility to detain applicant behind the bars till the conclusion of trial. Therefore, without commenting on merits of the case, **this bail application is allowed and applicant is admitted to bail to the satisfaction of learned Illaqa/Duty Magistrate concerned, subject to the following conditions:-**

1. That he will not try to influence any prosecution witness in any manner;
2. That he will appear in the court on each and every date of hearing to be fixed in the trial;
3. That he will not leave the territory of India without prior permission of the Court;

Observations recorded herein are for the limited purpose of the present application. Police record alongwith copy of this order be returned. This file be consigned to the record room.
