At this stage, plaintiffs' injunction petition under order 39 rule 1 read with section 151 of CPC is taken up for hearing.

Heard both sides.

Ld. Advocate for the defendant no.1 submits that he has no objection if an order of status-quo is passed in this suit upon both parties.

Perused the petition as well as the documents filed.

Considering the materials on record, I find that temporary injunction has been prayed against defendant no. 1 in this partition suit. As such, in view of the prima facie case of the plaintiffs and the consent of the concerned defendant with a view to preserving the suit property, it appears that an order of status quo may be passed in this suit with regard to its nature, character and possession of the suit property.

Hence it is,

**ORDERED**

that the plaintiffs' prayer u/o. 39 Rule 1 read with section 151 of the C.P.C is hereby allowed in the form of status quo.

Plaintiffs and defendant no. 1 to the suit are hereby directed to maintain status quo in respect of the nature, character and possession of the suit property as on this day till disposal of this suit.

Thus, plaintiffs' prayer for temporary injunction is disposed of.

At this stage, some postal receipts with postal track report in respect of some defendants, have been filed by the plaintiffs with firisti.

Plaintiffs to file affidavit to that effect.
