BAIL ORDER

1. This order of mine shall dispose of anticipatory bail application moved by the applicant-accused Manjeet Kaur in this case bearing FIR No.30 of 14.02.2019, U/Ss 420, 34 of Indian Penal Code, registered against her and others in P.S Sardulgarh, District Mansa, wherein it is submitted that the applicant-accused has nothing to do with the said offences. She is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case. The alleged money was deposited in the account of the trading company and a certificate

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regarding investment was issued. Moreover, no money was attributed to the applicant and as such, the allegations raised by the complainant against her for cheating are totally false. Nothing is to be recovered from the applicant-accused and as such custodial interrogation is not required. Now, the police is raiding house of the applicant and she has apprehension of her arrest in the present false case. So, the applicant-accused be released on anticipatory bail.

2. Notice of the bail application was given to the State and police record was also called, which is produced from PS Sardulgarh by ASI Ranjit Singh No.248/Mansa. No reply to the bail application was filed. However, Ld. Addl. Public Prosecutor for the State orally contested the bail application.

3. I have heard learned counsel for the applicant-accused, learned Addl. Public Prosecutor for the State and perused the police record carefully.

4. The present application has been filed by the applicant Manjeet Kaur as per the provisions under Section 438 Cr.PC to release her on anticipatory bail. Vide order dated 26.03.2019, passed by this Court, the applicant was directed to appear before the IO/SHO to join the investigation within two days and cooperate with the police. On her doing so, she be not arrested. Accordingly, in compliance to the order dated 26.03.2019 of this Court, the accused-applicant has appeared before IO/SHO and joined the investigation. Today on 29.03.2019, ASI Ranjit Singh No.248/Mansa appeared and made statement that the accused has joined the investigation and is not required for further investigation in the present case. As the applicant has complied with the above-said order of this Court, so the order dated 26.03.2019, passed by

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this court is made absolute and the bail application filed on behalf of applicant-accused is hereby allowed subject to compliance of the provisions of section 438(2) Cr.P.C. Police record be sent back and this file be consigned to the record room.
