This petition was coming up today before me for final hearing in the presence of Thiru. K. Siva, Advocate for the petitioner and the Deputy Superintendence of Police, Ariyalur represented for state and upon hearing both side arguments and perusing the petition and other relevant records, this Court is delivered the following;

ORDER

The petitioners have filed a petition u/s. 482 BNSS for granting anticipatory bail to the petitioners through E-filing.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioners have contended that the respondent police has registered a case against the petitioners in Crime No. 164/2026, u/s. 296(b), 329(3), 118(1), 115(2), 351(3) of BNS Act on 27.07.2026. The alleged date of occurrence was on 26.07.2026. The petitioners are no way

connected with the occurrence and a false case have been foisted on him. Hence, he prayed for anticipatory bail.

3. The respondent police has filed an objection stating that the petitioners have abused with filthy words and trespassed in to house of complainant and assaulted and damaged the gold chain and threatened to kill him. Further he stated that the injured is not hospitalized and one previous case pending against the petitioner in Crime No.69/2026. If the accused will be released on bail, they would be committed the same offence again.

4. This court perused the rival submissions of both side. The respondent police has registered a case against the petitioners in Crime No. 164/ 2026, u/s. 296(b), 329(3), 118(1), 115(2), 351(3) of BNS Act on 27.07.2026. It is submitted by the prosecution that petitioners have abused with filthy words and trespassed in to house of complainant and assaulted and damaged the gold chain and threatened to kill him. The injured person is not at all hospitalized in this case. Hence, on considering the facts and circumstances of the case and Considering the facts that the injured has been discharged from the hospital and considering the fact that the custodial interrogation of the petitioners are not necessary, hence, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with following conditions;

1. That the petitioners/accused shall be released on bail in the event of their arrest or their surrender or appearance on their executing a bond for sum of Rs.25,000/- along with two sureties each for the like sum to the satisfaction of the **Judicial Magistrate No.I, Ariyalur.**
2. That the petitioners/accused shall appear and sign before the **Respondent Police Station, daily at 10.00 A.M for 3 weeks.**
3. That the petitioners/Accused shall surrender on or before **13.08.2026** failing which the anticipatory bail granted to them shall stand cancelled under due process of law.

4. That the petitioners/accused shall not abscond during investigation or trial.
5. The petitioners/accused shall not tamper with evidence or witnesses during investigation or trial.
6. On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the concerned Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs State of Kerala (2005) AIR SCW 5560).
7. If the petitioners/accused absconds, the respondent police shall register a case U/s. 269 Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023.
