AD- INTERIM EX-PARTE ORDER on Draft Notice of Motion
Dt. 27/07/2026

1. The plaintiff suit. no. 1618/2026 preffed present draft NM dt. 27/07/02026 for Ad interim Ex-Parte injunction against defendant no. 1 and 2.
2. The plaintiff is public limited company incorporated under Companies Act, 1956 and part of Arvind Mafatlal Group. Defendant no. 1 is limited liability partnership and defendant no. 2 is designated partner of defendant no. 1.
3. The defendant no. 1 was engaged by plaintiff as an implementation partner for the said project. The plaintiff has instituted suit against defendant because the defendant published and circulated false and defamatory imputation concerning plaintiff.
4. Heard learned advocate for plaintiff. The learned advocate submitted that the plaintiff is entitled for ad interim ex parte injunction. In support of his argument he placed reliance on

The defendant has made defamatory statements in a letter dt. 26/05/2026 through email and addressed plaintiff as, 'fraudulent, dishonest, unscrupulous, immoral, double dealing', etc. Prima facie the letters dt. 20/06/2026, dt. 26/05/2026 shows that the defendant made defamatory statements. The plaintiff has made out prima facie case to issue ad interim Ex-Parte order. If injunction is not granted irreparable loss will cause to the plaintiff. The ratio led down in aforesaid cited case laws is squarely applicable to case in hand. This is fit case to grant Ex-Parte Ad interim injunction till next date. Hence following order :

ORDER

1. The pending hearing and final disposal of NM preferred on 27.07.2026 the defendants, their agents, partners, servants, or any person claiming through them are hereby restrained by an ad-interim ex-parte injunction from in any manner addressing, composing, writing, publishing,

circulating, uttering or communicating by e-mails, or letter or any other manner what so ever, whether to CSC e-governance services India Limited or any government authority or third party any false malicious or defamatory statement concerning the plaintiff till next date.

2. Issue notice to defendants asking why this order shall made not absolute.

3. Place the matter on board on fixed date 30/07/2026
