JUDGMENT:

1. The present complaint was filed by the In-charge, RPF Post Mukerian, under Section 174-C, 147 of the Railways Act on the allegations that on 31.01.2026, at about 18:35 hours, an information has been received regarding damage/cut of signal cable at K.No.1019-1027 at CGH-BPRS Loop Line. On receiving such information, RPF post reached at the spot and inspected the site. During investigation, the accused was apprehended on the basis of secret information. Thereafter he was

apprehend after completion of investigation challan was presented against the accused.

2. On appearance, copies of the complaint were supplied to the accused, free of costs.

3. Finding a prima facie case having been made out against accused, notice under Section 174-C, 147 of the Railways Act was served upon the accused. The contents of notice were read over and explained to accused in vernacular to which he pleaded guilty and claimed no trial.

4. Heard. Accused Ajay has confessed his guilt and this Court is satisfied that the plea of guilt made by the accused is voluntarily made and is without any pressure or coercion. Therefore, accused Ajay is held guilty and are convicted for commission of the offence punishable under Section 174-C, 147 of the Railway Act. Let, the convict be heard on the quantum of sentence.

QUANTUM OF SENTENCE:

Present: APP for the State/Railways.
Convict Ajay on bail with advocate Sh.Yuvraj Singh, Legal
Aid Counsel.

5. I have heard learned APP for the State/Railways as well as counsel for convict and perused the file carefully.

6. The convict stated that he has learnt a lesson from his

mistake and will not commit any offence in future. He has further stated that he is a poor person and only bread winner of his family. Convict prayed for taking lenient view. The plea of the convict is considered.

7. Keeping in view the nature of offence and antecedents of the convict, I am of the considered opinion that ends of justice would be fully met, if the convict be given opportunity to reform himself instead of sending him behind the bars. No new case has been reported by the prosecution to be registered against the convict after he was released on bail in the present case. So, it is a fit case where the convict can be released on probation. Accordingly, convict Ajay is ordered to be released on probation under Probation of Offenders Act, on furnishing of personal probation bonds in the sum of ₹20,000/- without surety thereby undertaking to maintain peace and be of good behaviour for a period of **six** months. The convict will remain under the supervision of legal-cum-Probation Officer, Jalandhar, who shall submit his report after **six** months of probation period, commencing from the date of this order. If the legal-cum-Probation Officer, Jalandhar, gives a satisfactory report after **six** months of probation period, the file will be disposed of and in case of non-satisfactory report of legal-cum-Probation Officer, Jalandhar, convict Ajay will appear and receive the sentence as and when called upon by the Court, during the aforesaid period. Copy of the order be sent to the legal-cum-Probation Officer, Jalandhar, for necessary compliance. The convict

is also directed to pay litigation costs of **Rs.1000/- (Rupees One Thousand)**. The litigation costs deposited against proper receipt. The Reader of this Court is directed to deposit the same in the Treasury under relevant head. Personal probation bonds furnished, which are accepted and attested. Case property, if any, be dealt under rules after the expiry period of limitation for filing the appeal or revision and disposal thereof, if any, preferred. File be consigned to the Record Room, Jalandhar after arranging, numbering and indexing the same.
