

Bail Matters 877/2026
STATE Vs. MUNNI
FIR No. 11/2026
PS- (Sun Light Colony)
u/s 20/29/61/85 of NDPS Act

This is an application under Section 483 of Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, filed on behalf of the applicant/accused Munni for grant of interim bail.

1. I heard arguments on the present application made on behalf of the applicant/accused Munni Begum for grant of interim bail for a period of 8 weeks.

2. Ld. Counsel for the applicant/accused submitted that the present interim bail has been sought on humanitarian grounds. Ld. Counsel further submitted that the daughter of the applicant/accused has recently delivered a child and is in need of immediate care and support. Ld. Counsel further submitted that the husband of the daughter is presently admitted in a de-addiction/rehabilitation centre and is not available to take care of her. Ld. Counsel further submitted that there is no other family member available to assist the daughter and the newborn child, and the presence of the applicant/accused is indispensable for their well-being. Ld. Counsel also submitted that the applicant/accused has two minor sons whose educational

formalities are ongoing and require her presence. Ld. Counsel thus, prayed that the applicant/accused ought to be granted interim bail.

3. *Per contra* learned Addl. PP for the State along with IO opposed the application on the ground that the allegations against the applicant/accused are serious in nature and the investigation is still in progress. Ld. Addl. PP further submitted that there is a likelihood of the applicant/accused absconding or tampering with evidence, if released on bail and thus, interim bail ought not to be granted to the accused.

4. Record perused.

5. As per the report of IO, the medical documents furnished by the applicant/accused have been verified and found as genuine.

6. At this stage, without commenting upon the merits of the case and considering the limited prayer for interim bail on humanitarian grounds, particularly the recent delivery of the daughter of the accused and absence of any other immediate caregiver, I am of the view that the applicant/accused has made out a case for grant of short duration interim bail.

7. In the aforementioned submissions, taking a lenient and humanitarian view, I deem it fit to grant interim bail to accused Munni Begum, w/o Sh. Abhijeet for a period of one week from the date of her release, on her furnishing personal bond with surety bond of Rs. 15,000/- with one surety in the like amount, subject to following conditions:

i) The applicant/accused shall not try to contact the prosecution witnesses in any manner;

ii) She shall not tamper with evidence in any manner.

iii) She shall also furnish her mobile phone and mobile phone of her surety to the IO and shall keep her mobile phone operational round the clock and shall share his Google PIN to IO.

8. In compliance of **Sanjay Singh Vs. State (Govt of N.C.T of Delhi) Writ Petition Criminal 974/2022**, copy of this order be sent to concerned Jail Superintendent to convey the order to inmate.

9. **Accused Munni Begum shall surrender before concerned Jail Superintendent on the expiry of her interim bail period.**

10. Order be given dasti.
