This petition came up before me on 19.07.2025 for inquiry in the presence of Thiru.A.Dineshkumar, Learned Advocate appearing for Petitioner and Learned APP Gr-II appearing for State and upon heard the both side arguments and perused the material available on records and having stood over for consideration till this day, this court delivers the following,

ORDER

1. This petition has been filed by the petitioner U/s.480 of BNSS seeking for bail alleged offence U/s.417, 420 of IPC.
2. The petitioner counsel would submit that the petitioner was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 08.07.2025 for the offences U/s. 417, 420 of

IPC. The alleged date of occurrence was on 01.01.2013 and the date of F.I.R. on 08.07.2025. The petitioner/accused is an innocent person and he has not committed any such offence, and he is falsely implicated in this case. The petitioner/accused is ready to offer adequate sureties by this court. The petitioner/accused is ready to obey any condition which will impose by this court. Therefore, the petition may be allowed.

3. Whereas the prosecution submitted reply stated that strongly objected to grand bail to this petitioner/accused A1 and the investigation is still pending. If the petitioner/accused is released on bail, he may abscond to somewhere and may tamper the prosecution witnesses and documents. Two other accused persons in this case have not yet been arrested by the police. Therefore, the bail petition may be liable to be dismissed.

4. Heard both sides. Records perused. Case of the prosecution is that this petitioner and her husband are daily wagers. The Petitioner/accused A1 and other six persons are jointly running a chit funds namely Sikaram Asset Promoters India Ltd. at Salem. The accused A2 Meena and one Elumailai have given a false promise to the defacto complainant and others to deposit money the above said chit funds and after the due period, they will got profit. The defacto complainant and other 27 persons were deposited each at Rs.600/- per month in 48 dues and everyone deposited to the above said chit funds at

Rs.30000/- . The petitioner/accused and other accused cheated the defacto complainant and others. The defacto complainant lodged a complaint against the accused before the District Superintendent of Police, Perambalur and the complaint forwarded to the District Crime branch and FIR was registered. The petitioner/accused A1 and A2 Meena were arrested on 08.07.2025 by District Crime Branch, Perambalur in Cr.No.23/2025 alleged u/s.417, 420 of IPC. Petitioner is in judicial custody for the past 12 days. No recovery from the accused and investigation is still pending. Offences involves huge amount from 28 persons. Hence, this court not inclined to allow this petition and liable to be dismissed.

In the result, this bail petition is dismissed.
