This is an application filed U/s. 483 BNSS on behalf of applicant/accused Manish for grant of bail.

Present: Mr. Lallan Kumar Singh, Ld. Addl. PP (Sub.) for the State.

Mr. Falak Mohammad, Ld. Counsel for applicant / accused.

Ms. Meenu, Ld. Advocate for the complainant.

IO ASI Rajendra, PS Kotla Mubarakpur, is present and has filed reply to bail application. Be taken on record.

Reply and case file are perused.

Arguments heard on bail application from both sides.

1. Ld. Counsel for applicant/accused argued that co-accused Niket Tiwari has already been granted regular bail by Hon'ble High Court of Delhi on 07/07/2026, whereas, co-accused Shiv Kumar @ Bablu has been granted regular bail by this Court on 15/07/2026. On the principle of parity, applicant/accused Manish is entitled to bail. Ld. Counsel for applicant/accused argued that deposition of PW1/complainant Sonia and PW2/injured has already been recorded and the trial of the case shall take time to complete. It is argued that applicant/accused has been in judicial custody since 05/06/2025 and he

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may not be further detained in custody by way of punishment during trial. It is submitted that the applicant/accused will maintain good and peaceful behaviour if granted bail.

2. On the other hand, Ld. Addl. PP, has strongly opposed the bail application with submission that the applicant/accused is facing very grave allegations of stabbing victim Ashish @ Chiku with knives, alongwith other co-accused persons. Ld. Addl. PP argued that in the charge-sheet as well as in his deposition, PW2/victim stated that he was stabbed multiple times by applicant/accused Manish and co-accused Tanish. As per MLC, victim Ashish sustained grievous stab injury on his chest as well as on left side of his abdomen. In fact, he suffered exposure and protrusion of internal organ from penetrative stab injury in the abdomen, that was dangerous to his life. As per discharge summary, the stab injury caused damage to kidney, diaphragm and liver of victim Ashish. He remained hospitalized from 02/06/2025 to 14/06/2025 because of the injuries. By sheer fortitude, victim Ashish escaped the death due to deep stab injuries.

3. Indeed, the causation of multiple stab injuries with knives and depth of the injury caused to victim Ashish reflect intent of the offenders to cause his death. The victim was fortunate to have survived the fatal assault. The principle of parity with co-accused Niket Tiwari and Shiv Kumar @ Bablu

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does not apply to the applicant/accused as he is the prime perpetrator of the offence. The bail has been granted to accused Niket Tiwari and Shiv Kumar @ Bablu as direct role in infliction of stab injuries is not attributed to them.

4. Considering the gravity of offence with apparent intent to commit murder and quality of evidence received against the applicant/accused, the Court does not find it fit case for grant of bail to the applicant/accused. The bail application is, therefore, dismissed.

The application is disposed of accordingly.

Copy of this order be given dasti to Ld. Counsel for applicant/accused, as prayed for.
