This OP (MV) having been finally heard on 13.07.2022 and the Tribunal on the same day passed the following:

AWARD

This claim petition has been filed by the claimant u/s. 166 of the MV Act claiming compensation of Rs.5,00,000/- on account of the injuries allegedly sustained by him in a road traffic accident.

2. The matter is fully and finally settled between the petitioner and 3rd respondent, for **₹ 3,50,000/- (Rupees three lakh fifty thousand only)**. Joint memo is filed. The compromise is accepted and recorded. The joint memo shall form part of the record.

- (a) The claimant is entitled to realize an amount of **₹3,50,000/- (Rupees three lakh fifty thousand only)** from the 3rd respondent.
- (b) As per the legal principles settled in the **Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Madras represented by its Registrar General Vs. MC.Subrahmanyam and others reported in AIR 2021 SC 2662 and and Noorudheen.V. v Muhammed Najmal 2021 (4) KLT 561** parties who have agreed to settle their dispute without requiring judicial intervention u/s.89 of CPC are even more deserving of the benefit of refund of court fee. In the light of the above principle, the claimant is exempted from payment of court fee.
- (c) The 3rd respondent is directed to deposit the award amount to the bank account of the claimant within a period of two months from today by way of electronic fund transfer.

- (d) The claimant is directed to produce attested copy of the PAN card and relevant pages of his bank pass book having details of the bank account number and IFSC Code of bank branch before this Tribunal within 7 days from the date of this award with copy to 3rd respondent.
- (e) If the claimant fails to produce the copy of the bank pass book as directed above, the interest on compensation shall cease to run after the expiry of the above 7 days.
- (f) In the event of default of payment by 3rd respondent, the claimant is entitled to get interest @ 8 % on the settled amount from the date of award.
