PW19 W/Constable Geeta has been further examined-in-chief, cross-examined and discharged.

PW23 Ms. Mudika Soni Pandiya and PW24 Dr. Parshuram Singh have been examined and discharged.

An application for grant of interim bail for a period of 40 days on medical ground filed on behalf of the applicant/accused Aman is pending.

Arguments on the application heard. Reports received from jail regarding the medical condition of the applicant perused.

Ld. Counsel for the applicant has submitted that in the year 2025, the applicant had undergone surgery for tumor in the backbone and after the surgery, he is suffering from pain in backbone and rib and swelling in legs and is facing difficulty in breathing and movement of his body. He has submitted that despite bringing the above complaints into the knowledge of the jail authorities, no proper medical treatment is made available to the applicant and there is a requirement of complete body

checkup including tests such as MRI, CT Scan etc. to assess the medical condition of the applicant. He has submitted that since the family members of the deceased and other public witnesses have already been examined, there is no possibility of influencing the witnesses by the applicant. On the above submissions, grant of interim bail has been sought so as to enable the applicant to obtain proper medical treatment from a private hospital.

The application has been opposed by the Ld. Chief PP for the State. He has submitted that the surgery of the applicant was got conducted by the jail authorities and all the required medical aid is being made available to him in jail.

Upon receiving the application, the report regarding the medical condition of the applicant was sought from the jail. A perusal of the said reports shows that on the complaint of pain in left shoulder joint and left knee, the applicant was initially provided treatment by the jail visiting Senior Resident Doctor of Orthopedic Department but since the pain persisted, the applicant was sent to GTB Hospital on 05.05.2026 for medical evaluation. In the latest report dated 20.05.2026 received from the jail, it is reported that there is no swelling or tenderness over the joints and that after being examined by the Specialist at GTB Hospital, the applicant is being provided the prescribed medicines from the Jail OPD. It has further been reported that the applicant has been taught exercises by the jail visiting Physiotherapist and currently, his condition is stable. There is nothing in the report to suggest that the applicant is suffering from any life threatening ailment or requires immediate hospitalization. It would not be out of place to mention that the applicant is facing trial for the commission of

offences under Sections 80/85/3(5) and Section 103(1) BNS and the matter is almost at the fag end. Considering the overall facts and circumstances of the case and the medical reports of the applicant received from the jail, no ground for grant of interim bail is made out. The application is accordingly dismissed. However, the Jail Superintendent is directed to ensure that the prescribed medicines are made available to the applicant and if so advised by the attending doctor, the required medical tests of the applicant be got conducted.
