Record is taken up for passing order in final form as exparte.

The present case has been initiated by the petitioner namely Anirban Das u/s 13(1)(ia)(ib) of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955. The present case was initiated on 16.04.2025 before this court over the cause of action dated 18.09.2024.

It also found that the jurisdiction of filing this case has been maintained properly as the petitioner presently residing in this jurisdiction. Notice has been served to the O.P/wife and she appeared before the court and pray for filing written statement. Written statement was filed. O.P subsequently did not appeared. The case ultimately heard ex-parte against the O.P/Wife namely Aparajita Das @ Shil. D/O – Late Sankar Prasad Shil, W/O – Anirban Das of 34/2, N.K.Ghosal Road, P.S – Kasba, Distt. - Kolkata-700042.

The case in nutshell is that the petitioner Anirban Das married to O.P Aparajita Das @ Shil as per Hindu rites and customs on 16.01.2009. The marriage became registered on 28.08.2010 as per the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 before the Registrar Subir Majumder and he issued the Certificate SL. No. 149/2010, Page – 723 dated 28.08.2010. It shows that the O.P begotten one male child named Arjodeep @ Aryaan Das on 28.09.2016. The child is living with the O.P / mother.

It is alleged in the petition that the opposite party started to live with the petitioner in a house as husband and wife. Petitioner make arrangement at Bhubneswar to stay there but there was no allegation against the parents of the petitioner by the respondent/wife. After begotten child the behaviour of the respondent/wife changed and tried to stay separately with the petitioner by leaving the parents of the

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petitioner. The parents of the respondent also offer Rs. 25,00,000/- for searching a flat to reside separately.

The respondent/wife brought allegation against the father of the petitioner which was humiliating. Petitioner returned to Kolkata after leaving job but from also terminated. Petitioner went to Mumbai. The petitioner took care of the respondent and his son. Petitioner borne all the expenses of education of his child and he used to pay Rs.15,000/- to Rs.20,000/- to his wife.

It has been stated that the respondent giving allegation one fine morning in the month of January, 2018 leaving the house of the petitioner and started to live with her parents with the kid. Several attempts have been made for reconciliation of the matter with the intervention of family members and friends but in vain.

Lastly, the petitioner received a letter of Maintenance Case on 30.09.2024 claiming maintenance though he had incurred all the expenses of his child and wife.

Petitioner came to conclusion that respondent/wife is not willing to stay with him and the petitioner took decision to file divorce suit on the ground of cruelty and desertion.

The petitioner found no other alternative but to initiate this present case for dissolution of marriage. It shows that the intimation upon the respondent/wife served with notice and she came before the court but lastly she did not contest the case. The case ultimately proceeded with Exparte. The petitioner has been examined in this case as P.W.1 exparte to substantiate his case. It has stated in the affidavit-in-chief as corroborated the petition. The mother of the petitioner has been examined as P.W.2 exparte to substantiate the case of the petitioner. It has stated in the affidavit-in-chief as corroborated the petition.

It is found from the entire evidence on record as well as the averment mentioned in the petition shows that the marriage was



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consummated between the parties in the year 2009. The averment made by the petitioner solely banked upon the grounds of desertion and cruelty u/s 13(1)(ia)(ib) of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.

It is found from the entire evidence on record and orders that the O.P / respondent got ample opportunity to contest the case. Relying upon the contention and unchallenged testimonies filed by the petitioner, this court has no other option but to pass an order of decree in favour of the petitioner by dissolving the marriage dated 16.01.2009 in between the petitioner Anirban Das and Aparajita Das @ Shil.

Hence, it is,

ORDERED

that the Mat. Suit being No. 1057 of 2025 be and same is decreed ex-parte and the marriage between **Anirban Das** and **Aparajita Das @ Shil** solemnized on 16.01.2009 as per Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 and registered on 28.08.2010 as per the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 before the Registrar Subir Majumder is hereby dissolved from this day of order.

The Marriage certificate issued by the Registrar Subir Majumder and he issued the Certificate SL. No. 149/2010, Page – 723 dated 28.08.2010 is declared void from this day.

No order as to cost.

The Mat. Suit bearing no. 1057 of 2025 is hereby disposed of.

A copy of this order be supplied to the petitioner free of cost.
