This is an application u/s 483 of BNSS for grant of bail filed on behalf of applicant/accused Salim.

1. Reply to the present bail application filed. Same is perused.
2. Ld. Counsel for applicant/accused submits that the applicant/accused was arrested on 24.01.2026 and since then, he is in judicial custody. He has been falsely implicated by the police officials in the present case. The present FIR is false and baseless. The applicant is having small children and old aged parents who are totally depend upon the applicant as he is single bread earner of the family. The material i.e. ganja was not recovered from the instance of applicant and it was planted upon him. The applicant was stopped by the police officials and thereafter, police officials made a false story and implanted the aforesaid material upon him. The investigation qua the applicant has already been completed and he is not required in judicial custody for any means. The applicant never involved in any criminal activity and never indulged in any type of offence ever. The applicant undertakes that he will not misuse the liberty of bail and will appear on each and every dates of hearing in future. He also undertakes that he will not tamper with evidence, if released on bail.

3. Ld. Addl. PP for State strongly opposed the present bail application submitting that the offence committed by the accused is serious in nature as 3668 gram ganja was recovered from his possession. If he is released on bail, he may tamper with the evidence and threaten the witnesses. He prayed that the present bail application may be dismissed.

4. Submissions heard. Record perused. Considered.

5. Since the offence committed by the applicant/accused is grave in nature, the investigation in the present matter is still going on, the applicant/accused has been specifically named in the FIR and recovery of 3668 gram *ganja* was made from his possession, I am not inclined to grant bail to the applicant/accused, at this juncture. Hence, the present bail application filed on behalf of applicant/accused Saleem is dismissed.

6. The aforesaid application is disposed off accordingly.
