STATE Vs. KRISHAN KUMAR SINGH

Accused Krishan Kumar Singh produced from JC.

1) Mr. Himat Singh, Ld. Additional PP for the State opened the case of the prosecution by describing the charge of murder under Section 103 (1) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (BNS) brought against the accused, namely, Krishan Kumar Singh (accused person).

2) Ld. Additional PP for the State submitted that the prosecution to prove the guilt of the accused person to lead evidence and examine over 45 witnesses/for any other witnesses with the permission of the court. Ld. Additional PP for the State further submitted that the accused person on the morning of 06.04.2025 took the son, namely, Ashish of the complainant, Latesh in the bathroom on the pretext of shower and brutally stabbed him knife. Latesh kicked the bathroom door repeatedly and on its opening saw the accused person with a knife and blood and his son Ashish lying on the floor. As the accused person pointed the knife towards Latesh, she ran outside her home to save her life and went to the house of her landlord Manoj Shokeen. When Latesh's and Manoj Shokeen came back towards the 3rd floor, the saw Ashish lying in a pool of blood on the staircase of 2nd floor. Latesh alongwith Manoj and Abhishek wrapped Ashish in a bedsheet and took him to hospital.

3) Mr. Himat Singh further submitted that the accused person has motive to kill Ashish and in a premediated planned manner purchased knife around 05 days prior to the date of incident of murder on 02.04.2025. Accused made payment towards purchase of knife through UPI. The motive is ascertain from repeated fights between Latesh and the accused person. Further, the accused person had pawned the jewellery items of Latesh and taken a loan. During the course of investigation, substantial evidence in the form of video footage capturing the accused person running away from the crime scene has been gathered and annexed alongwith the chargesheet. Lastly, the accused person was apprehended in the vicinity/neighbourhood of the crime scene i.e., IGNOU Road.

4) Mr. Vikram Kumar, Ld. Counsel for the accused alongwith accused contended the submissions advanced by Ld. Addl. PP for the State and submitted that the accused person has been wrongly framed for the murder of Ashish. Mr. Kumar submitted that it is the mother Latesh who committed the murder of her own son Ashish, as Latesh was unhappy with her marriage with Uma Shankar and the child born from her wedlock with Uma Shankar. It was Krishan Kumar Singh who tried to break open the bathroom door when he heard the screams of the child. Mr. Kumar further added that when the accused person saw Latesh having killed her own son and screaming he ran away from the crime scene on being scared for his own life.

5) Heard.

6) The court is of the opinion that there is ground assuming that the accused person, Krishan Kumar Singh has committed an offence of murder of Ashish, a six year old boy and an offence punishable

under section 103 (1) Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023. Accordingly, charge is framed against the accused person, Krishan Kumar Singh under section 103 (1) Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 to which he plead not guilty and claim trial.

7) Matter be kept back.
