Order : Accused is convicted and sentenced to pay fine of
Rs.300/- for the offence punishable u/s. 269 of IPC.
In default of payment of fine the accused shall
undergo simple imprisonment for 3 days.

This case came up for consideration today and the court on the same day passed the following:

JUDGMENT

This is a case charge sheeted by the Sub Inspector of Police, Ernakulam Town South Police Station against the accused alleging commission of offence punishable u/s. 269 of the Indian Penal Code.

2. Accused present. Copy served. When the particulars of offence were read over and explained, accused pleaded guilty. Plea was found to be genuine and voluntary and hence accepted. Accused is found guilty of offence u/s. 269 of IPC and convicted thereunder.

3. Having regard to the facts of the case, I am of the view that sentencing the accused to pay fine alone would do the purpose in the interest of justice. At the same time, it is not a fit case where the accused is entitled to get the benefit of the benevolent provisions of the Probation of Offenders Act, 1958.

4. In the result, the accused is sentenced to pay a fine of Rs.300/- for the offence u/s.269 of IPC. In default of payment of fine the accused shall undergo simple imprisonment for 3 days.
