ORDER

1. Present petition has been filed by the petitioners namely Bal Krishan alias Bhiri, Rajvir Kaur alias Raj and Amrik Singh alias D.C., for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.116 dated 28.05.2026 under Sections 115(2), 118(1) and 3(5) of BNS, registered at Police Station, Sirhind.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that in the present case the alleged injury is attributed to Bal Krishan @ Bhiri on the right hand of the complainant Manish Kumar. He further submitted that neither any specific weapon is specified nor it is alleged as to what type of injury was given on the hand of complainant Manish Kumar. He further submitted that CCTV footage shows that in fact the complainant already had beaten petitioner No.1. So far as, the petitioners No.2 and 3 are concerned, they are not attributed any injury. He further submitted that the petitioners have already joined the investigation. Thus, the petitioners may be released on anticipatory bail.

3. On the other hand, learned Public Prosecutor for the State, on instructions from ASI Mann Singh, submitted that petitioners have joined the investigation, but, keeping in view serious nature of allegations, the petitioners are not entitled to be released on anticipatory bail.

4. I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned Public Prosecutor for the State. Perusal of the FIR shows that the alleged injury is attributed to Bal Krishan @ Bhiri on the right hand of the complainant but no weapon has been mentioned in the FIR. It is the case of the petitioners that CCTV footage shows that in fact the complainant had beaten the petitioner No.1. Perusal of the FIR further shows that the petitioners No.2 and 3 are not attributed any injury. The petitioners have joined the investigation. Moreover, there is nothing on record from where inference can be drawn that petitioners shall tamper with the evidence or shall abscond. Thus, keeping in view above, without commenting on the merits of the case, interim order dated 02.07.2026 is made absolute.
