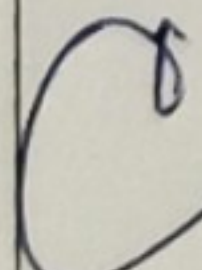

	16/1/2026 304.05/26 16/01/26	1. The bail petitioner is represented. 2. The CD as called for is received. 3. I have heard both the parties. 4. Seen the bail filed on behalf of the accused, Shri Sukursing Terang praying to allow the accused to go on bail. 5. The accused was arrested on 22/12/2025 in connection with Dokmoka P.S case no: 32/ 2025 under Section 61(2)/318(4)/ 316(2) BNS. 6. The informant Shri Sahit Basumatary has filed the ejahar on 21/12/2025 and alleged therein that he became acquainted with the accused Shri Sukursing Terang about one and a half months prior to the incident and the said accused Shri Sukursing Terang promised him to give Government job in Forest Department upon payment of Rs.10,00000/- and accordingly on 20/12/2025 he arranged for and gave Rs.10,00000/- to the accused Shri Sukursing Terang and then Sukursing Terang took him to Dokmoka for giving	

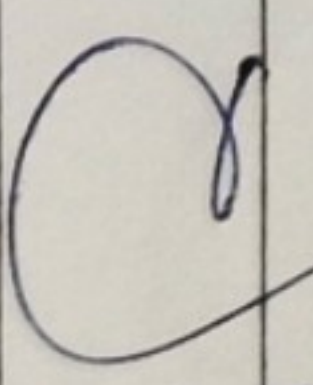

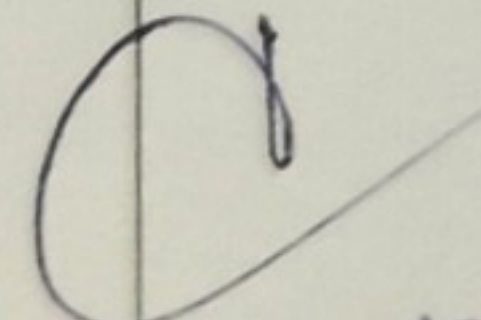

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Continued 16/1/2026  Sessions Judge, Karbi Anglong, Diphu, Assam	him appointment letter for his job, but on the way an Alto car came and stopped them and four persons came down from the said car and looted Rs.10,00000/- from them; hence this case as the informant suspects that the accused, Shri Sukursing Terang is involved in the alleged offence. 7. During investigation, the police had arrested the accused Shri Sukursing Terang and recovered Rs.1,00,000/- on being led by the accused Shri Sukursing Terang and also came to know about the identity of the other co-accused. 8. It has come out during investigation that the alleged robbery/kidnapping attempt was stage managed by the accused Shri Sukursing Terang and one Shri Amar Kro and three other persons and that they had distributed the Rs.10,00000/- equally amongst themselves. 9. The Ld. Counsel for the bail petitioner has submitted that accused may be released on bail as nothing incriminating was recovered from the possession of the accused. It is also

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Continued 16/1/2026	submitted that admittedly some amount of money was recovered from the house of the accused, however, the same would not implicate the accused in this offence. 10. The Ld. PP has submitted that there is sufficient material against the accused person; as such to reject the prayer for bail. 11. It is submitted by the Ld. PP that there is material to show that the accused Shri Sukursing Terang was a part of the conspiracy and the IO has recovered money from the possession of the accused; hence the prayer for bail may be rejected at this stage. 12. The IO has also filed written objection praying to reject the prayer for bail as he may hamper the progress of investigation and tamper evidence. 13. It is revealed from the perusal of the CD and the statements of the materials witnesses of this case including the statements of the victim that the accused promised to give government job to the victim/informant on payment of bribe, which itself is an offence and

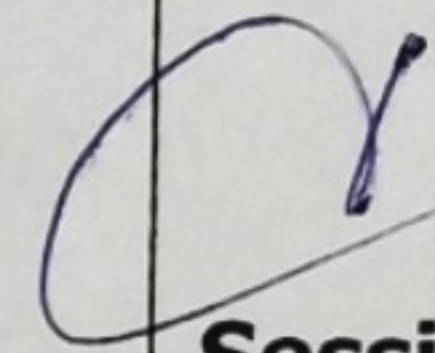

It is also seen that the investigation is in progress the remaining amount of Rs.9,00,000/- is yet to be recovered and other co-accused are also on run. 15. It is also seen from the perusal of the CD that the IO has collected sufficient material by way of recovery of Rs.1,00,000/- on being shown by him and also from CDR call detail records which shows that the accused Shri Sukursing Terang was in constant touch with the other co-accused Shri Amar Kro. 16. It is also seen that the nature of the offence is such that if the accused is released on bail, then he might be in a position to influence key witnesses of this case and also might hamper the progress of investigation and destroy vital evidence. 17. In view of the above discussions and considering the grave nature of the offence and the early stage of investigation,

the prayer for bail is rejected at this stage.
