This is an application for grant of interim bail moved on behalf of the applicant / accused Rohit Pal on the ground of illness of his father.

Present:- Shri Harvinder Nar, Ld. Addl. PP for the State.
Sh. Gagan Bhatnagar, Ld. Counsel for the applicant / accused **Rohit Pal.**
IO SI Sachin Dabas joined through V/C.
Doctor has also joined the proceedings through V/C.

It is submitted by Ld. Counsel for the applicant / accused that father of the applicant is suffering from piles and fistula and doctor has advised surgery and at the time of surgery, one attendant is required. It is further submitted that there is no other responsible person in the family to take care of the father of the applicant / accused and prayer is made for grant of interim bail for 30 days for taking care of his father.

Reply from IO received.

Ld. Addl. PP for the State has strongly opposed the bail application and argued that applicant is involved in murder case and if applicant is released on interim bail, he may jump the jail and he may threaten the witnesses. It is further argued by Ld. Addl. PP that doctor has advised surgery for piles and fistula and mother, other children and relatives are there to take care of the father of the applicant / accused and presence of applicant is not required and prayer is made for dismissal of the present application.

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Arguments heard. Record perused.

Allegations against the applicant / accused are serious in nature as applicant is involved in murder case. As per the reply furnished by the IO, mother of the applicant is there to take care of the father of the applicant / accused. Apart from mother, other children and relatives are also there to take care of the father of applicant/accused in his absence. Father of the applicant can be attended by his wife, other children and relatives and presence of applicant / accused is not required for taking care of his father.

Keeping in view the overall facts and circumstances, no ground for interim bail is made out. Hence, the present interim bail application of the applicant / accused Rohit Pal stands dismissed.

Application stands disposed of accordingly.
