By this order, I shall dispose of the application for waiving off the fine of Rs.20,000/- imposed upon the applicant/convict vide order on sentence dated 22.09.2025.

I have heard counsel for the applicant and have perused the material available on record. In my opinion, the application can be disposed of straightway without issuing notice to the non-applicant.

The case of the applicant/convict Deepak is that vide order on sentence dated 22.09.2025, he was sentenced rigorous imprisonment for a period of four years and a fine of Rs.20,000/-

in default three months simple imprisonment for the offence punishable under section 394/34 IPC. He was also sentenced for a period six months rigorous imprisonment for the offence punishable under section 506/34 IPC. Being aggrieved by the same, he preferred the Criminal Appeal No. 20/2026 before the Hon'ble Delhi High Court wherein vide order dated 25.03.2026, his sentence was suspended during the pendency of the said appeal subject to furnishing personal bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- with one surety of the like amount subject to the satisfaction of the trial court and also subjected to verification that the amount of the fine be deposited with the trial court.

Vide the present application, it is prayed that the fine of Rs.20,000/- imposed vide order on sentence dated 22.09.2025 may be waived. In law, this court/trial court has no power to review the order on sentence. **Accordingly, the application is dismissed.**
