**ORDER:-**

Heard on the bail application filed by the applicant-accused Dilpreet Singh Basra on the ground of false implication. Learned Counsel for applicant has argued that applicant is innocent and is in judicial custody since a considerable period of time. It is pleaded and argued that alleged recovery falling in less than commercial quantity already stands effected and no useful purpose shall be served by keeping the accused behind bars for an indefinite period. It is thus prayed that applicant/accused be granted bail.

2. On the other hand, learned Special Public Prosecutor for NCB Sh. L.S.Rai, Advocate opposed the present bail application by filing

detailed written reply to the effect that recovery of 0.557 kgs of opium has been effected in the present case concealed in two bike shockers black color which was destined for UK. The substance recovered from first shocker was marked as Mark LOT LI and the contraband recovered from second shocker was marked as Mark LOT-L-2. The weight of contraband recovered from first shocker was 0.258grams opium and the contraband recovered from second shocker was 0.299 grams opium. On 5.5.2026, on the basis of voluntary statement of Dilpreet Singh Basra under Section 67 of NDPS Act and other evidence collected so far accused was arrested after explaining him the grounds of arrest. The investigation is at its preliminary stage and efforts are being made to ascertain the courses and destination of contraband. It is also to be investigated from where the accused has arranged the contraband i.e. opium and how many times he has already sent the opium through courier to abroad. It is also to be established about the other members of international drugs syndicate. In case, he is released on bail that there is every likelihood that he may again flee. Prayer for dismissal of the bail application has thus been made.

3. After giving thoughtful consideration to the submissions made by counsels for the parties, this court is of the considered view that although recovery effected of the opium is 0.557kgms which is not of commercial quantity, but the way it was being smuggled cross borders, an prima facie on the basis of the record of the investigation produced so far, it has been found that the applicant/accused has been actively participating in smuggling narcotic from one place to the

other even cross borders. Such an act of the applicant/accused has international ramification. The applicant/accused seems to have been facilitating the smuggling of the drugs to various countries at International level by investing funds from his own and also by getting the parcels prepared. All those factors are under investigation and are culminating in the report and which will be tried and tested in the trial. Although, the applicant/accused is in judicial custody but having regard to the gravity of the facts, circumstances and offence, this court has found him not entitled for the concession of bail.

4. Without commenting on the merits of the case and considering the gravity of offence involved in the present case, no ground is made out to grant him bail. The bail application of applicant/accused Dilpreet Singh is found meritless and same is hereby dismissed. Papers of the instant bail application be attached with the main complaint, if already presented otherwise same be consigned to the record room.
