**Bail application u/s 483 of BNSS, 2023 for grant of
regular bail.**

ORDER

- 1 Seeking his release from custody in above referred First Information Report, the petitioner has approached the Court, seeking bail.
- 2 Upon notice, learned Additional Public Prosecutor put in appearance. Record was produced from concerned Police Station
- 3 Brief facts of the case are that complainant is in possession over the land since 09.12.2019, agreed to be purchased from Harbhajan Singh son of Saudagar Singh. However, Harbhajan Singh did not execute the sale deed in favour of the complainant, regarding which, civil matter is pending before the Court at Jagraon. On 05.06.2026, at 2.15 pm, complainant was irrigating his above said fields. Gurjant Singh, Jaggi and Manpreet Singh armed with sword and iron pipes along with two

unknown persons armed with sticks came on the spot in a Swift car bearing registration no. DL-05CL-0223. Gurjant Singh raised Lalkara to take possession of the said property from complainant and gave sword blow on complainant, which was missed. Jaggi gave iron pipe blow on the right knee of Devinder Kumar. Gurjant Singh snatched mobile phone of Sukhchain Singh and Devinder Kumar and handed over the same to Jaggi. Thereafter, the culprits ran away from the spot.

The petitioner was nominated lateron and arrested on 09.06.2026.

- 4 Learned Counsel for the petitioner would argue that the petitioner is neither named in the First Information Report nor he committed the alleged offence and has been falsely implicated in this case. He has argued that since 09.06.2026, the petitioner is in jail and is no more required for custodial interrogation.
- 5 Per contra, learned Additional Public Prosecutor has argued that the petitioner is nominated in the First Information Report, but he was nominated lateron. He has committed serious offence, so he does not deserve concession of regular bail.
- 6 Having heard learned Counsel for the petitioner and learned APP for the State and after perusing the record, I am of the considered view that the petitioner is entitled to be released on bail. The petitioner is not named in the FIR rather, he was nominated during the course of investigation. The petitioner is in custody for **one month** and recovery has already been effected. Criminal liability of the petitioner, is subject

matter of trial on the basis of evidence adduced. Further detention of the petitioner would not serve any purpose. Co-accused of the petitioner have already been released on regular bail by the Court of Sh. B.S. Ramana, learned Addl. Sessions Judge, Ludhiana and principle of parity applies to the case of petitioner. Hence, without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the bail plea of the petitioner is allowed and he is ordered to be released on his furnishing bail bonds to the tune of Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the Jurisdictional/Duty Magistrate concerned.

7. However, the petitioner shall adhere to the following conditions during his stay out of the prison:

1. The petitioner shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court.
2. The petitioner shall not interfere into the investigation in any manner whatsoever.
3. The petitioner shall not indulge/involve in similar activities during his bail period.
4. The petitioner shall remain present in the Court on each and every date of hearing after presentation of final report till conclusion of the trial.

8. Failure to comply with any of the above said condition would entail cancellation of bail order automatically without any specific order.

9. Bail application stands disposed of. File be consigned to the records after due compilation.
