

**Bail Matters 447/2026
STATE Vs. AMAN

This is second application u/s 483 of BNSS r/w section 187(2) BNSS filed on behalf of the applicant/accused Aman Kumar.

Ld. Counsel argued that accused/applicant is innocent and has been falsely implicated in the present case. It is further submitted that the first regular bail application was dismissed on 05.02.2026 & contended that present application is for statutory bail. It is further submitted that the accused/applicant was arrested on 07.01.2026 and since then he is in JC. It is further submitted that the contraband allegedly recovered from the applicant/accused is of intermediate quantity. It is further submitted that the stipulated period of 60 days has already been lapsed, however, till date no chargesheet has been filed. It is further submitted that applicant/accused is ready and willing to

file bail bond. With these submissions prayer is made for grant of default bail.

On the other hand, Ld. Chief PP for the state and IO has strongly opposed the present application on the ground that the allegations against the accused are serious in nature. Ld. Chief PP has admitted the factum of non-filing of chargesheet in the present case.

In the present case allegations against the applicant/accused are that on 06.01.2026 he was apprehended and 3.51 grams of Buprenorphine tablets & cash amount of Rs.17,000/- was recovered from his possession. In the present case, the alleged recovery of the contraband from the possession of the applicant/accused is of intermediate quantity. Applicant was arrested on 07.01.2026 and stipulated period for filing the chargesheet has already been lapsed on 07.03.2026. However, no chargesheet or formal report is filed against the accused. However, accused is rightfully entitled for the relief of statutory bail/default bail. Accordingly, peeing in view the totality of facts and circumstances of this case, the applicant/accused is admitted to default bail upon furnishing of personal bond in sum of ₹20,000/- with one surety of the like amount and subject to the same conditions :

1. That the accused will not jump the bail and will appear in the court regularly.

2. That the accused shall join the investigation as and when required by the IO.
3. That the applicant shall provide his mobile number to the Investigating Officer and intimate about any change.
4. That accused shall not indulge into similar offence or any other offence in the event of release on bail.
5. That accused shall not tamper/influence any evidence/ witness in any manner.
6. That in case of change of residential address, accused shall intimate the court about the same within a week.
7. That the applicant shall not leave the country without prior permission of the court.

Nothing stated hereinabove shall tantamount to be an expression of final opinion on the merits of the case. With above observations, application stands disposed off accordingly.
