

State Vs. Gurpreet Singh (BA-2584-2020 CNR NO.PBSAB1002586-2020)

Bail application put up before me being Duty Officer. Reply to bail application filed by the state. Ld. APP for the State verbally opposed the bail application on the ground that accused has committed serious offences and should not be given the benefit of bail. Heard on bail application. The allegations against the accused are under Sections 379/473/411 of IPC with the averments that the accused had stolen motorcycle and put fake number plate on the same.

The Ld. Counsel for the accused has argued that the accused is in custody since 28.12.2020. The accused has been falsely implicated. No recovery is to be made from the accused. As such, he may be released on bail.

I have heard the submission of the Ld. APP and Ld. Counsel for the accused. The allegations against the accused are under Section 379/473/411 of IPC with the averments that accused Gurpreet Singh had committed theft of motorcycle and was found in possession of the same after affixing fake number plate on it. The accused is in custody since 28.12.2020. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the accused behind bars but rather he will be a burden on the state exchequer. No further recovery is to be made from the accused. Accordingly, accused is granted regular bail subject to furnishing of bail bonds to the tune of Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount. Bonds not furnished. Papers shall be taken up again as and when application is moved for furnishing bonds. Meanwhile, papers be attached with the pending remand papers. Papers alongwith file be sent back to concerned court immediately.
