ORDER :

1. This order of mine shall dispose of the bail application filed by applicant-accused under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case FIR No. 101 dated 24.08.2020, under Sections 22 & 29 of the NDPS Act registered at P. S. STF Mohali (Bhawanigarh), District Sangrur.
2. Notice of the bail application was given to the Ld. Addl. Public Prosecutor for the State and police record has also been requisitioned.

3. I have heard learned counsel for the applicant-accused and learned Ld. Public Prosecutor for the State and have gone through the police record very carefully.

4. Learned counsel for the applicant/accused has contended that the applicant/accused is an innocent person and has been falsely implicated in the present case. He has not committed any offence. No recovered is to be effected from him. The applicant-accused is ready to join the investigation and co-operate with the same. Hence, a prayer has been made to admit the applicant/accused to interim anticipatory bail.

5. The Ld. Addl. Public Prosecutor for the State, on the other hand, has opposed the bail application by submitting that the applicant-accused escaped from the spot, whereas his co-accused persons were apprehended by the police party alongwith the car bearing registration No.HR-51BA-1783 and 45000 intoxicant tablets of Clovidol 100 SR, 12500 intoxicant tablets of Carisoma, 450 vials of Wincirex syrup were recovered from the said car. In order to ascertain the source of said contraband and for thorough investigation of this case, the custodial interrogation of the applicant-accused shall be required. A prayer has been made to dismiss the bail application filed by the applicant/accused.

6. From the perusal of the file, it transpires that the present case FIR has been registered against the applicant-accused and his

co-accused on the basis of secret information. When the police party on the basis of secret information tried to apprehend the applicant-accused, he fled away from the spot whereas his co-accused persons were apprehended by the police party alongwith the car bearing registration No.HR-51BA-1783 and 45000 intoxicant tablets of Clovidol 100 SR, 12500 intoxicant tablets of Carisoma, 450 vials of Wincirex syrup were recovered from the said car. Heavy recovery of such contraband has been effected in this case. For thorough investigation of this case and to probe the role of applicant-accused, his custodial interrogation in this case shall be required. As such, applicant-accused is not entitled to the concession of anticipatory bail. Hence, the anticipatory bail application filed by the applicant-accused is ordered to be dismissed. Bail application file be attached with the remand papers.
