ORDER:

1. This order of mine shall dispose of the application U/s 438 Cr.P.C filed by accused-applicant Kashmir Kaur Sahota. Contention of learned counsel for accused-applicant is that applicant is apprehending her arrest at the hands of police officials of PS Beas, Amritsar Rural in a false complaint moved by one Sucha Singh against applicant stating that applicant has executed a title deed of the property located within the area of Beas in favour of wife of Sucha Singh but subsequently this fact is revealed that present applicant is already having a property dispute with

previous owners from whom present applicant is already having a property dispute with previous owners from whom present applicant purchased such property. A false complaint has been filed by the complainant which has been marked to DSP Amritsar Rural and 3 days back one ASI Gurwinder Singh had come to the house of applicant. Before the police applicant was threatened to bow down before wrongful and illegal demand of complainant.

2. On the other hand, learned Addl.P.P opposed the bail application on the ground that no FIR has been registered against the applicant and as such, there is no apprehension of arrest of accused and the application is required to be dismissed.

3. Perusal of the file shows that as per report received from Police Station Beas, no FIR has been registered against the accused-applicant in the police station till date. So mere allegations cannot be treated as apprehension of arrest to the accused-applicant. Hence, this court does not find any merit in the contention raised by learned counsel for the applicant-accused. Accordingly, the application seeking anticipatory bail stands dismissed. File be consigned to the record room.
