J U D G M E N T

1. The applicant has filed present application under section 267 of the Indian Succession Act, 1956. It is mainly contended inter alia by the applicant that their Late widow Smt Jasuba Mangalsinh Sartansinh died on 23-07-2024 (Herein after referred to as "the deceased" for short). The deceased had executed a registered will on 31-7-2007 and the applicant is named as beneficiary of the will for the immovable properties of the deceased. He has also stated that the applicant is the only beneficiary of the properties of the deceased. Therefore, he has prayed to issue probate for the will dated 31-7-2007 in favour of the applicant.

2. The present petition was filed on 18-4-2025 and an order was passed to publish a public notice in local daily newspaper. Accordingly, public notice was duly published in daily Divya Bhaskar on 8-05-2025 inviting objections from the public against grant of probate in favour of the applicant.

3. Heard L.A. Shri R.J Zhala, for the applicant. Going through the examination in chief filed by the applicant no. 1 at exh. 6, examination in chief of attesting witness of the will Mr. Bhupendrabhai Dilubha Chudasma at exh. 07 and documentary evidence like will executed by deceased vide exh. 10, death certificate of the deceased vide exh. 09, 8A extract vide exh. 11, village form no 7 extract vide exh. 12,13 it is clear that the deceased had died on 23/7/24 and she was the owner of the immovable property mentioned in her will and the applicant has been appointed as beneficiary of the will. Moreover, no objections from the public has been received against grant of probate in favour of the applicant. Therefore, there is no reason to reject the present application. Hence, I pass the following final order.

ORDER

1. Present Civil Miscellaneous Application filed under the provisions of the Indian Succession Act, 1956 is allowed.

2. The applicant is directed to pay requisite Court fees. And on payment of the Court fees office is directed to issue probate as per rules for the properties as mentioned in the Will, which is reproduced hereunder.

Immovable Property :

Village:Devgana,Taluka;Ranpur,Khata No 237,Revenue Survey No. 226 (Old Survey No. 102/1), admeasuring 6 Hectares 15 Are 91 square metre,Rs 28.05 paise and Revenue Survey No. 89 (Old Survey No. 154/1), admeasuring 3 Hectares 70 Are 34 Sq. Mtrs,18.35 Paisa.

3. The applicants shall furnish P.R. Bond and Simple Surety to the extent of value of property for which probate is granted.

4. This Civil Miscellaneous Application stands disposed of accordingly.
