

The plaintiffs and defendants have filed compromise petition under Order XXIII Rule 3 of C.P.C.

The plaintiffs and defendants submitted that, they have compromised the matter between themselves. The present suit is filed for the relief of declaration and permanent injunction.

The plaintiffs and defendants filed compromise petition under Order XXIII Rule 3 of C.P.C., stating that the matter is settled amicably and they prayed that decree may be passed in terms of compromise petition.

The contents of compromise petition are readover and explained to the parties in the language known to them. The parties have understood and admitted that the contents of compromise petition is true and correct and on examination by the Court, it is stated by the parties that they are entering into compromise with free will and there is no any compulsion, coercion or fraud of any kind from anybody.

On perusal of the compromise petition and on examination of the parties, it appears that the parties are compromising the matter with their free will and voluntarily and the compromise arrived at is lawful.

O R D E R

The compromise petition filed under Order XXIII Rule 3 of C.P.C. is hereby allowed.

The suit is decreed in terms of compromise petition.
