ORDER

1. This order shall dispose of the first regular bail application of applicant/accused for the offence committed under Section 305 331(6), 111 BNS, Police Station: Tanda, Distt.Hoshiarpur.
2. Ld. Counsel for applicant/accused argued that accused/applicant has been falsely implicated in the present case and he is in custody since 03.08.2025. He further argued that present FIR has been registered on false

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3. complaint of complainant, whereas he has no concern or link with the alleged occurrence. The trial of the case will take long time and no useful purpose will be served by keeping the applicant/accused behind the bars. So, he prayed that the accused may kindly be released on bail.

4. On the other hand, Ld. Addl. PP for the State argued that the applicant/accused has committed serious offence. So, the applicant/accused does not deserve the concession of bail and prayed that the bail application may kindly be dismissed.

5. I have heard the learned counsel for the applicant/accused and learned Addl. PP for the State and perused the record on the case file carefully.

5. Perusal of the FIR reveals that present FIR was registered on the statement of complainant Daljit Kaur to the effect that she is a household lady. She lives in her house with her husband Karamjit Singh, father in law Banga Singh, mother-in-law Jasvir Kaur, daughter Prabhjot Kaur and son Harjot Singh. In the night of 26.07.2025, all of them were sleeping in their two rooms. Her father-in-law Bagga Singh had gone to the veranda outside the house at 01:30 AM on 27-7-2025 and he shouted to open the door. On this, complainant woke up and opened the main door of the house and she saw six unknown persons were standing near Banga Singh, whom she could not recognize. They were armed with Datars and one person was armed with a pistol, entered the house, one of whom put a pistol like object upon her son Harjot Singh's head and started asking about the money and jewelry kept in the house while threatening to kill him, but when she refused, they

started hitting her knees, both hands and arms and all the belongings in the house started scattered and they stole her father-in-law's gold bracelet, mother-in-law's gold chain, ear rings and daughter's gold ear rings and about Rs.2000/- from her father-in-law's purse and threatened them and left on the spot along with their weapons. Then her husband taken her to Waves Hospital, Tanda, for treatment.

6. ASI Rajwinder Singh, No.249/HPR, PS Tanda, appeared and made statement that he is I.O. of the present case and brought the police record. This is the first regular bail application filed by applicant/accused. No other similar bail application is decided or pending in any other court. No other FIR has been registered against the accused/applicant.

7. This court is of the view that as per the allegations the applicant/accused entered into the house of complainant alongwith deadly weapons like Pistol at about 1.30 AM on 27.07.2025 and caused injuries to complainant and her family members and committed theft and the investigating agency has also invoked Section 111 BNS, which deals with the organized crime as some of the members of the group were having previous record of crime as submitted by the I.O. present in the court. They also caused injuries on the person of complainant Daljit Kaur when she refused to disclose the place where the valuable items were lying. Ultimately they fled away with the gold ornaments and Rs.2000/- from the Wallet of her father in law. So, keeping in view the seriousness of allegations and the fact that Section 111 BNS, which deals with the organized crime is also invoked by the investigating agency. Therefore, no ground is made out to release the

applicant/accused on bail as the investigation is at initial stage. Hence, bail application is hereby dismissed. File be consigned to the record room.
