Bail application presented today before me being Duty Magistrate and the same is forwarded by the Retainer Lawyer. It be registered. The offence attributed to the accused/applicant is punishable under section 406, 420 IPC. As can be culled from the record, accused is in custody since long. As such he fulfills the criteria so laid down in the recommendations issued by PULSA on 25.3.2020.

Being alive to the guidelines/instructions issued by the Ld. Executive Chairman (PULSA) on 25.3.2020 and consequent letter dated 26.3.2020 issued by the Principal Secretary/Jail and letter dated 27.3.2020 issued by the Member Secretary (PULSA) in the wake of pandemic COVID-19, the accused/applicant is hereby admitted to interim bail for six weeks.

As it would not be feasible for the accused/applicant to furnish surety bond on account of curfew/lock down imposed in the entire State, so, accused is admitted to interim bail on furnishing his/her personal bonds in the sum of Rs.25,000/-. Personal bonds received through Deputy Jail Superintendent which have been accepted and attested. Accordingly release warrant be issued forthwith.

Needless to say that on expiry of the aforesaid period of six weeks, the accused/applicant shall surrender himself before the concerned trial court/Jail. Copy of this order be sent to the concerned Jail Superintendent through E-mail/Fax/online sources for immediate compliance.
